Letter Father Yvans Jazon

Dear Parishioners,

As we journey to celebrate Jesus at Easter, we continue to open our heart to be with him on the cross. Certainly, we have experienced a great Lenten Season with our spiritual life lifted on high. I hope everyone takes the time to go to confession. Easter is two weeks away; therefore, there is still time to reconcile with the Lord in order to prepare ourselves fully to celebrate one of the greatest feasts in our Catholic Faith "our Lord's resurrection". This weekend, we are reflecting on the gospel where a woman was accused of being caught in adultery. She was led to Jesus to be condemned and she was subjected to be stoned to death. She would also be served as an opportunity for the scribes and the Pharisees to set up questions that would challenge Jesus' teaching. However, in the story we can see she had a special encounter with someone who does not judge her but who understands her sorrow and her pain. She met someone whom she would never forget. This encounter was a great moment that led her to change her life forever. As she waited to hear Jesus' verdict, she knew that she was guilty. She had already passed the judgment on herself and she accepted Jesus' right to do the same. Perfectly understanding the secret intentions of her self-righteous accusers and the helplessness of the repentant sinner, Jesus gave his verdict: "Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her." Jesus turned the accusers' attention back on themselves and made them realize that they too were sinners. St. Augustine puts Jesus' stand as follows: "Let this woman be punished, but not by sinners; let the law be applied, but not by its transgressors." The woman was brought to a place of reparation of her reputation, the place of forgiveness and the place of reconciliation with the society and the Lord. Pope Francis calls on all of us Catholic Christians to be in perfect reconciliation to our God in this Jubilee year of Mercy. His message to all of us Christians spoke clearly to bring compassion as a part of our daily spiritual lives. He stated: "For all of us, then, the season of Lent in this Jubilee Year is a favorable time to overcome our existential alienation -6398. by listening to God's word and by practicing the works of mercy. In the corporal works of mercy, we touch the flesh of Christ in our brothers and sisters who need to be fed, clothed, sheltered, visited; and through the spiritual works of mercy counsel, instruction, forgiveness, admonishment and prayer, we touch more directly our own sinfulness". Yet, the Lord does not look at our sins or our past life but he wants a contrite heart as the psalmist stated in psalm 51 which is a prayer of contrition: "Sacrifice to God is a broken spirit, a broken contrite heart you never scorn". The gospel for this Sunday is a great lesson for us as Jesus calls on each one of us to be responsible for our sins and accept our guilt so we receive forgiveness. The readings also encourage us to reflect seriously on the ultimate example of God's compassionate love for us. My brothers and sisters, the most important aspect of our lives is to obey God's commandments with our body, mind and spirit. When we fail to comply with God's law, we act against Him and His creation. May the blessing of the compassionate God be upon you.

Misericordiae Vultus

Grace, mercy, and peace to all who continue to prayerfully reflect on Pope Francis' letter. In his words, "...so they may contemplate the face of mercy." (4)

Pope Francis continues,,,,,,,, "The Evangelist reminds us of the teaching of Jesus who says, 'Be merciful just as your Father is merciful' (*Lk* 6:36). It is a programme of life as demanding as it is rich with joy and peace. Jesus's command is directed to anyone willing to listen to his voice (cf. *Lk* 6:27). In order to be capable of mercy, therefore, we must first of all dispose ourselves to listen to the Word of God. This means rediscovering the value of silence in order to meditate on the Word that comes to us. In this way, it will be possible to contemplate God's mercy and adopt it as our lifestyle.

The practice of *pilgrimage* has a special place in the Holy Year, because it represents the journey each of us makes in this life. Life itself is a pilgrimage, and the human being is a *viator*, a pilgrim traveling along the road, making his way to the desired destination. Similarly, to reach the Holy Door in Rome or in any other place in the world (ours is in Cape May - others are listed in the *Star Herald*) everyone, each according to his or her ability, will have to make a pilgrimage. This will be a sign that mercy is also a goal to reach and requires dedication and sacrifice. May pilgrimage be an impetus to conversion: by crossing the threshold of the Holy Door, we will find the strength to embrace God's mercy and dedicate ourselves to being merciful with others as the Father has been with us." (13-14)

Once again we pause from the text to really listen with our hearts to Francis pleading and prayer for us.... Silence (being alone with God) and then pilgrimage (action to do what we are called to do.) Reading the Misericordiae Vultus is only our first step-we need to stop and privately pray over it again and again so that "it will be possible to contemplate God's mercy and adopt it as our lifestyle" In these few remaining weeks of Lent let us put habits of "pieces" of silence into our lives..... "and dedicate ourselves to being merciful with others as the Father has been with us". (14) "Lives can change when habits change". (Matthew Kelly)

Closing the Gap

The word "radical" means to get to the root of things. Jesus was a radical. Jesus was interested in getting deep down to the root of things. He was interested in what was essential- not the topping but the heart of the matter....the core, the root, the truth. His life and teachings are a radical invitation to come beyond what most of us have settled for in our every day lives He wants us to get down to the core of what matters- my personal relationship with Him.

Lent is the time to close the "Gap" between my life and the life Jesus invites me to live in the Gospel. There are many ways to get close to Jesus. Some are simple and can be practiced in the flow of everyday activity, while others require a time and place set apart from the busy, noisy, world. But they all require time and effort. Here are four practical daily ways to "Rediscover Jesus".

Read the four Gospels - over and over again for 15 minutes each day.

Practice the Prayer Process - This is a simple process designed to help you enter into a daily conversation with Jesus. (page 123)

Deny yourself - Find a handful of small ways to deny yourself each day.

Practice Spontaneous Prayer- Talk to Jesus as the events of your day unfolds.

Lives change when habits change...begin a brand new day. Resist any temptation to put it off. Close the relationship gap between you and Jesus.. (taken from Mathew Kelly's book <u>Rediscover Jesus</u> pages 112-115.)
