### **Letter from Father Yvans Jazon**

Dear Parishioners,

The fourth Sunday of Easter is traditionally known as Good Shepherd Sunday. This is also the "World Day of Prayer for Vocations". This week let us voice our prayers to the Lord to send more Vocations to his Church for the fulfillment of his peoples' Spiritual needs. The liturgy for this weekend has clearly described the role of the shepherds of God's flock in the Church. Good Shepherd Sunday reminds us that Jesus is our Shepherd who devotedly and kindly takes care of his flock. His role as our shepherd is to feed, nurture, comfort, correct, and protect his flock. Most of the time we imagine God as an authoritarian figure but the liturgy of this weekend invites us to HAVE another experience of God who guides and helps us to grow.

What are the figures of a good shepherd in the bible? The good shepherd lives for his sheep. That means there is a mutual dependency. However, the shepherd is unique vis-a-vis his sheep. Jesus as a good shepherd knows all his sheep. He said in John 10:14, "I'm the good shepherd, I know my sheep and they know me." For the Lord, each and every one of us is unique and physically irreplaceable. This is the reason why he will never abandon us, even though we close our ears or follow our own path in life instead of allowing Him to lead and guide our way. No matter how many times one gets lost or wanders from the path of righteousness the good shepherd is still there to rescue and to bring us back to life and to a safe place. We always sing the beautiful song of Psalm 23 "the Lord is my shepherd there is nothing I shall want". One may have his or her own personal struggles but God does not exclude you because you are weak or struggling. Instead, He wants you to hear His voice. In John 10:27 He said "my sheep listen to my voice; I know them, and they follow me". When we listen to the voice of Jesus Christ we receive the advice necessary to continue on the journey. We also receive the important messages that lead and guide us in the right way and good direction. Jesus will not abandon us even though we get hurt on our journey or we are in distress because of life's circumstances. In the book of Ezekiel 34:16 the Lord promises: "I will search for the lost and bring back the strays. I will bind up the injured and strengthen the weak... I will shepherd the flock with justice".

This responsibility is also entrusted to each one of us in our own mission. For instance, those entrusted to our care, as priests, doctors, nurses, and other missions that we have in our community. The Gospel and the readings for this fourth Sunday of Easter give us comforts and challenges. 1) Comfort because the message helps us to remember that God is always there for us. 2) Challenge is that pastors and lay people alike, should be good shepherds to those entrusted to their care. We become good shepherds by loving those entrusted to us when we pray for them, spending our time and talents for their welfare, and guarding them against physical and spiritual dangers.

We need to hear and follow the voice of our shepherds through their homilies, Bible classes, counseling, and advice. This gospel not only invites the shepherd to devote his life to the sheep but for the sheep to listen to the voice of the shepherd. This aspect invites us to remain good sheep in the fold of Jesus. Our local parish is our sheepfold, and our pastors are our shepherds. As the good sheep of the parish, parishioners are expected to receive the spiritual food their pastors provide by regular participation in the Holy Mass; by frequenting the Sacraments; and by attending prayer services, renewal programs, and missions. The parishioners, as good sheep, should cooperate with their pastors by giving them positive suggestions for the welfare of the parish, by encouraging them in their duties, by lovingly offering them constructive criticism not to destroy their reputation, but to encourage them to become better shepherds. Let's continue to pray and encourage our parish community to pray for vocations to priestly ministry and religious life, so that we may have more good shepherds to lead, feed and protect the Catholic community.

### Misericordiae Vultus

Once again Pope Francis' Letter will speak of something he has already done for us during this past Lent. He has sent us "Missionaries of Mercy". Perhaps you have heard of them or their "where abouts"- if not yet- their paths may cross ours soon. ...... and so.... Grace, mercy, and peace to all who are continuing to reflect seriously, engage prayerfully and act boldly on Pope Francis' letter which challenges us to be...... "Merciful like the Father". (MV14)

Pope Francis continues,,,,,,, "During Lent of this Holy Year, I intend to send out Missionaries of Mercy. They will be a sign of the Church's maternal solicitude for the People of God, enabling them to enter the profound richness of this mystery so fundamental to the faith. There will be priest to whom I will grant the authority to pardon even those sins reserved to the Holy See, so that the breadth of their mandate as confessors will be even clearer. They will be, above all, living signs of the Father's readiness to welcome those in search of his pardon. They will be missionaries of mercy because they will be facilitators of a truly human encounter, a source of liberation, rich with responsibility for overcoming obstacles and taking up the new life of Baptism again.

They will be led in their mission by the words of the Apostle: "For God has consigned all men to disobedience, that he may have mercy upon all" (*Rom* 11:32). Everyone, in fact, without exception, is called to embrace the call to mercy. May these Missionaries live this call with the assurance that they can fix their eyes on Jesus, "the merciful and faithful high priest in the service of God" (*Heb* 2:17).

I ask my brother Bishops to invite and welcome these Missionaries so that they can be, above all, persuasive preachers of mercy. May individual dioceses organize "missions to the people" in such a way that these Missionaries may be heralds of joy and forgiveness. Bishops are asked to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation with their people so that the time of grace made possible by the Jubilee Year makes if possible for many of God's sons and daughters to take up once again the journey to the Father's house'. May pastors, especially during the liturgical season of Lent, be diligent in calling back the faithful "to the throne of grace, that we may receive mercy and find grace" (*Heb* 4:16). May the message of mercy reach everyone, and may no one be indifferent to the call to experience mercy. (18)
