Letter from Sister Rosaline

Dear Parishioners,

The Third Sunday of Advent or Laetare Sunday is our celebration today. John the Baptist challenges us to change our lives. We are never too old; nor are we incapable of this change. It is important for us to remember that Jesus, his parents, relatives and friends are all Jewish. There is no baptism in the Jewish tradition. The word *baptism* stems from the Greek word *baptizo*, which means *to wash*, *to dip under, to immerse*.

In the Jewish tradition, the ritual of dipping or immersing in water, is understood as spiritual cleansing rather than a physical act. The water must be living water (fresh, running water as in the River Jordan.) This cleansing is called *mikveh* which in Hebrew refers to any gathering of waters or bath for purification. The prophet Jeremiah tells us that God is the *mikveh* of Israel. In other words, God is the hope, or the awaited of Israel. To take the cleansing bath, John preaches is to turn toward God and the hope Jews await. It is an act of conversion that commits one to new ways of acting.

In today's gospel John insists that his hearers must pay attention and change their daily lives before they receive baptism. John tells them to share their belongings and food with those who are without clothes and food. He tells tax collectors to collect only the money taxes require. He tells soldiers not to bully people nor accuse them falsely. John reminds them and us to practice justice in our everyday lives and work.

Since it is only after we have chosen to take care of others, that we can immerse ourselves in the water and receive the baptism of repentance. John teaches that not being clean is a spiritual condition rather than a physical one.

When people wash in the Jordan, they express a commitment to just living – they will turn toward sharing, express honesty in taxes and business by respecting others and building peace. They now, have become not only children of Abraham by blood, but people of the covenant by commitment. A woman goes to the *mikveh* after the birth of a child to signify the life change. Jesus was baptized to signify his change in direction from his private life to his public life. We, as adults, no longer share the ritual of *mikveh* with our Jewish brethren, but we do share the responsibility to care for those who are without the basics of life.

Just as John the Baptist helped the people of his time examine their consciences, Pope Francis is calling us to ecological conversion. He wants us to change our way of thinking about progress, so that it can include and sustain all people. Are we willing to accept this challenge? What are we able to do? Let's talk about the places in creation that brought us joy. What are some practical ways and steps we might take to participate in the "culture of care" that Pope Francis wants us to build? What are some actions that we might practice which will keep the earth sustainable? How do we experience joy?

Keeping everyone safe is our main concern and in order to accomplish this we ask that you please follow the procedure below when weather is not favorable in the morning to attend Mass:




