## Letter from Fr. Cesar

Dear Parishioner,

With the baptism of the Lord the season of Christmas is concluded; and as Saint Justin Martyr said, concludes the revelations that Christ makes of himself to humanity. The question that worries many is: Why Jesus insists on being baptized? The baptism of John was of repentance and expressing the deep desire to be purified of sin. Within the mystery of the Redemption Christ wanted to be counted among sinners. In his incarnation Christ sympathizes with humanity. Solidarity, as defined in the Catechism of the Catholic Church in paragraph 1948, "is the virtue ... that leads to the exercise to communicate spiritual goods ". Obviously this does not preclude the material goods which are necessary and are not the most important. In this solidarity is based some articles of faith that we express in the Creed as they are in "the communion of saints" and the "unity of the Church" refers to the solidarity between the Church triumphant and militant to which we belong. St Paul says in his letters that Christ gave himself up for his Church and that is the reason to talk about a "redemptive solidarity". This solidarity was expressed in the death of the Lord. If it is true that they did not have to be baptized by not be sinner in the same way should not die because the scriptures said: " death is wages of sin ". What we celebrate today is the gift to be children of God. Christ wanted to share with us, to the very depths of our being and our fate in an absolute way, without the sin. In this way and through the Solidarity he wanted to transform that same reality. Not only did he want to be counted among sinners, but Christ seized all of the sins of mankind and its consequences. In reality it is not the water of the Jordan which purifies Jesus. But on the contrary, it is he himself who gives the water the power of sanctifying. Our baptism is the real participation in his Passover and therefore we are truly regenerated to be new creatures. From our own freedom, we opened our soul to the Divine Grace, so that the action of the Holy Spirit makes us children of God and members of the Church.
