From the desk of Sharon Mattia, Administrative Assistant

Dear Friends in Christ,

"Daughter, be of good comfort, thy faith hath made thee whole, go in peace." These words were spoken by Jesus when He healed a woman who was considered "unclean" by the Jewish Community. According to the Gospel, she had spent a great deal of time and money trying to be cured and all she had to do was touch Jesus and she was immediately set free.

Though I have known that story for years, I was completely overwhelmed watching that scene in The Chosen. In that moment, when Jesus called her "Daughter," I realized I was His daughter! I cannot adequately describe how I felt. At that moment, my heart was full in the knowledge that He loves me unconditionally and He would never abandoned me. As I had indicated previously, I had a difficult childhood and because of that, I felt no one, no one, no matter who it was, could love me enough. As a child, when you are traumatized, it is life-altering. In my mind, I have always known He loves me unconditionally, but I do not think I ever really felt it in my heart until that moment. I realized that despite my many sins and weaknesses, He has always loved me and has always been with me. All I needed to do was invite Him in, give Him control and love Him as He loves me, make Him the center of my life and have faith in Him.

When I first converted to Catholicism, I was filled with such peace, love and joy. However, eventually I allowed life to get in the way. I recently told a friend I wanted to feel that way again and, though, it's a journey and, like most of us, I want instant gratification; I am learning I need to be patient. I need to trust that God is in control and when he speaks to me, it is in His time. I need to have faith in His love for me and know that He forgives me. I need to know that when I fall, He'll pick me up. All I need to do is ask. Whenever I feel alone, disappointed in myself, life events, or another person, I try to remember how much He loves me. I ask Him to wrap His loving arms around me and guide me. He is my Father and when I spend time with Him, my heart is full, and my life is complete. What else do I need?

The world we live in can be challenging and at times frightening. I feel safe when I put my faith in His wisdom and trust that I am not in control. What a joy it is to know that we are all His children. We are loved unconditionally. There are no strings attached. We are sinners and He forgives us every time and He will never abandon us. I know I want to have the same faith as the "unclean woman." After suffering for years, she had faith and just simply touched His clothing and was healed, in His time.



Reading I : Isaiah 62:1-5

God rejoices over you.

- The first reading from Isaiah compares the renewed city of Jerusalem to a radiant bride of the Lord.
- The image of marriage was often used to describe God's covenant relationship with the people.
- In today's passage, this image was designed to hearten the discouraged Jewish people as they attempted to rebuild their city.

Reading II: 1 Corinthians 12:4-11

One Spirit gives different gifts to each.

- In the second reading Paul reminds the Corinthians that they should use their spiritual gifts with order and reverence.
- The gifts are from one Spirit and will build the Christian community into one body.
- The presence and the generous sharing of these gifts are signs of the messianic age, the glorious wedding feast of God's kingdom.

Gospel : John 2:1-11

Jesus' first miracle at a wedding in Cana.

- Today's reading is the first miracle story in the Gospel of John.
- Throughout John's Gospel, Jesus' "hour" referred to the combined moments of his passion, death, resurrection and ascension.
- At the wedding in Cana, Jesus responds to his mother's request by performing a miracle to symbolize that hour.

Theme: Grace is God's free gift to us.

Breaking Open the Word

Suggested text for faith sharing: Today's Gospel

Step One: Listen to the Word

As you hear this reading, what words or phrases strike you? What in this reading touches your heart? What lingers in your memory?

Step Two: Look into Your Life

Question for Children: What is one special gift that God has given to you to share with your friends or classmates? Question for Youth: Jesus got his start in ministry through the urging of his mother. Who urges you to pray, go to Church, and do good works?

Question for Adults: God fills each of us with grace (miracles) and gifts, what is one grace (miracle) or gift that you have shared with your family?


