

You've all heard the phrase, "the power of prayer," but unless you personally experience it, those are just words and unless you pray you won't experience the power of prayer. Quite a conundrum isn't it? Do you struggle with prayer; not praying enough, not having a conversation with our Lord, not spending enough time with Him?

We are almost through the Lenten Season which is a time for us to reflect on our lives, acknowledge our sins and seek forgiveness. It is also a period for spiritual preparation for the celebration of Jesus' resurrection. Lent encourages practices like prayer, fasting and almsgiving in order to foster a closer relationship with God and strengthen spiritual discipline. Traditionally, during Lent, many abstain from a favorite item, be it food, TV shows, Facebook, candy, alcohol, etc. Up until last year I tried to give up a favorite "something" and was never successful. I felt like a failure by not being able to give something up for Jesus, who gave so much for me. Last year during his homily Father Mazz suggested doing something extra, such as, help a needy person, pray more, volunteer. When I spoke to a friend about this they suggested I use the Hallow app, but I wasn't going to pay to pray! Therefore, I used Laudate and decided to meditate on the rosary every day. I can't say that I was completely successful, but I did much better than I would have if I gave up a favorite item. However, once Easter was over that was it; I finished my commitment.

This year I made the same commitment but added more prayer time by using the Hallow app. I realized there were so many useless apps/streaming services I pay for, why wouldn't I pay for Hallow? I actually began this journey before Lent and have continued. I'm still not 100% successful, but I'm getting better and it has become part of my normal day. I now have a routine of spending time with God throughout the day. I can attest that spending more time with our Lord has definitely helped me. After praying, I feel refreshed and energized. I've noticed several changes in my mood, my outlook is positive and generally I'm not as grumpy. I feel that my heart, mind and eyes have been opened in so many different ways. I am more aware of my faults, I see my fellow humans in a better light. I am kinder and more at peace. That being said, I'm certainly not perfect and still have many negative moments. However, when I recognize those moments, I realize it is Satan, and when that happens, I pray for strength and ask for forgiveness. This year I am committed to continuing this practice instead of ending my commitment when Easter is over, which is why, I am grateful for Father's suggestion.

I've discovered "doing something extra" during Lent offers the opportunity to make, whatever that something extra is, part of a routine. There are apps you can download that can help enhance your prayer life. The Hallow app helped me not only increase my prayer life, it has helped educate me as well. There are other apps such as; Ascension/Bible & Catechism, Laudate, Catholic Prayer & Bible are just a few.

So if you've been in a "spiritual slump" during this Lenten season, it's not too late to add more time with God to your schedule. It's certainly something you can do anytime and prayer definitely has power!

Reading I : Isaiah 43:16-21

God makes a new way for us.

- After exile in Babylon, the Jews were allowed to return to Jerusalem.

- In today's Gospel, the Pharisees, intent on trapping Jesus, present a woman accused of adultery to him.
- Jesus did not contradict the law nor declare the woman guiltless.
- Instead, he forgave the repentant sinner and confronted her accusers with their own sinfulness.



Saint of the Week:

Joseph of Arimathea, Layman, First Century Joseph of Arimathea was a righteous and virtuous man who was a member of the Sanhadrin and a searct discin

who was a member of the Sanhedrin and a secret disciple of Jesus. When Jesus was brought before the Sanhedrin to be condemned to death, Joseph opposed their decision. After Jesus died on the cross, Joseph asked for Jesus' body and wrapped the body in clean linen and laid it in a new tomb. Legend has it that Joseph inherited the chalice, the Holy Grail, used by Jesus in the Last Supper. Joseph led a group of missionaries to Glastonbury where they built a new church in honor of Our Lady. He is the patron saint of funeral directors.

Feast Day: St. Joseph of Arimathea is the patron of funeral directors. Though he has no memorial on the liturgical calendar, he is honored on March 17.

Joseph's message today: After Jesus' death on the cross, Joseph chose to reveal himself as a follower of Christ, a move which must have caused his expulsion from the Sanhedrin. We too are sometimes asked to make sacrifices in the name of Jesus.


