From the desk of Jonathan Delgado, Director of Music and Liturgy

Dear Parishioner,

Today the Church celebrates this Sixth Sunday in Lent as both Palm and Passion Sunday. Jesus went to Jerusalem to join other Jews to celebrate the Passover feast. Palm/Passion Sunday marks the beginning of Holy Week As recorded in the Gospels, Jesus entered Jerusalem riding a donkey with the townspeople waving branches and palms in front of Him as a sign of homage. This was a customary practice for people of great respect. Palm branches are a symbol of peace and victory and the use of a donkey instead of a horse represents the humble arrival of someone in peace. The very people who cheered and applauded Jesus' entrance into Jerusalem, will, shortly be shouting "Crucify Him."

The Holy Week liturgy presents us with the actual events of the dying and rising of Jesus. This liturgy broken into Three Days enables us to experience in our lives here and now what Jesus went through then. Just as Jesus did, we too must lay down our lives freely by actively participating in the Holy Week liturgies. In doing so, we are allowing Jesus to forgive us our sins, heal the wounds in us caused by our sins and the sins of others and transform us more completely into the image and likeness of God.

The Sacred Triduum will be held at The Church of the Assumption and begin on Holy Thursday, Mass will commemorate the Last Supper of Jesus with His disciples. Holy Thursday celebrates the institution of the Eucharist as the true body and blood of Jesus Christ and the institution of the sacrament of the priesthood (be sure and wish your parish priests a Happy Anniversary on this special day!). Twelve parishioners will have their feet washed during the Mass to represent Jesus washing the feet of His disciples, the first priests (if you are willing to take part in this please call me at the Parish Offices).

The commemoration of the crucifixion of Jesus and His death at Calvary will be held at 3PM on Friday. The service is broken into three parts: the Liturgy of the Word, the Adoration of the Cross, and Holy Communion. Good Friday is a day of fasting and abstinence.

The Easter Vigil ("the mother of all vigils") begins on Saturday at 8PM. The Vigil is packed with symbolism and meaning. Our parish is blessed to have 5 Catechumens who will be initiated into the Church by receiving Baptism, Holy Communion and Confirmation.

Let us remember that Holy Week can only become "holy" for us if we actively and consciously take part in these most sacred Three Days. The very moving spiritual "Were You There" asks the question, "Were you there when they crucified my Lord? Were you there when they nailed Him to a tree?" The answer is yes. Yes, we were there in the crowd on both days, shouting 'Hosanna!' and later 'Crucify Him!' Let us again be with Him this week and as Simon the Cyrene did, help Him carry his Cross as He helps us every day to carry our very own crosses.

May this coming week be the holiest week for you all!



Reading I: Isaiah 50:4-7

God helps us.

- The first reading from Isaiah is one of four passages that focus on the "servant" of God.
- In all four examples, the servant is faithful, even in the face of suffering.
- The servant in today's passage stands by his belief that with God on his side, he will not be put to shame.

Reading II: Philippians 2:6-11

God's name is holy.

- Scripture scholars believe that today's second reading was a familiar early Christian hymn.
- The purpose of Paul's hymn for the Philippians is to persuade the community to be united in Christ.
- Paul uses the example of Jesus' self emptying obedience to encourage the community to end its divisions.

Gospel: Luke 22:14-23:56

Jesus shows us how to love.

- Similar to the description of the servant of Isaiah, Jesus willingly accepted the suffering and anguish that can be the price of fidelity.
- Throughout the Gospel of Luke, Jesus is depicted as the faithful prophet who speaks God's word even in the midst of his own suffering.
- In today's account of the Passion of Christ, Luke emphasizes the innocence of Jesus.

Family Reflection Corner

Theme: Jesus shows us how much He truly loves us.

Breaking Open the Word

Suggested text for faith sharing: Today's 2nd Reading, from St. Paul

Step One: Listen to the Word

As you hear this reading, what words or phrases strike you? What in this reading touches your heart? What lingers in your memory?

Step Two: Look into Your Life

Question for Children: In your own words, what does the suffering and death of Christ mean to you? Question for Youth: How can you spend time with each member of your family this week in a way that will communicate your love for them?

Question for Adults: What sacrifices have you made this week to show your love for others? What sacrifices have others made for you?





Cyril was a great teacher of the early Church. Because of Cyril's teaching skills, the bishop of Jerusalem asked him to prepare catechumens for Baptism. Cyril explained the beliefs of the Church to the catechumens. His lectures on the creed and the sacraments are the best records of the kind of instruction that catechumens were given in the early Church. Even after Cyril himself became the bishop of Jerusalem, he continued to give these lectures because he considered the work so important. In 381, Cyril and Gregory both attended the Council of Constantinople where an

amended Nicene Creed was adopted. At this council, many of his contemporaries praised Cyril as a champion of orthodoxy against Arianism.

Feast Day: An antional mamorial honors St. Cyril an

Feast Day: An optional memorial honors St. Cyril on March 18. In 1882, Pope Leo XIII declared him a Doctor of the Church.

Cyril's message today: Cyril took a strong stand for what he believed in. At the cost of placing ourselves in the middle of controversy, we too must sometimes stand up for what we believe.


