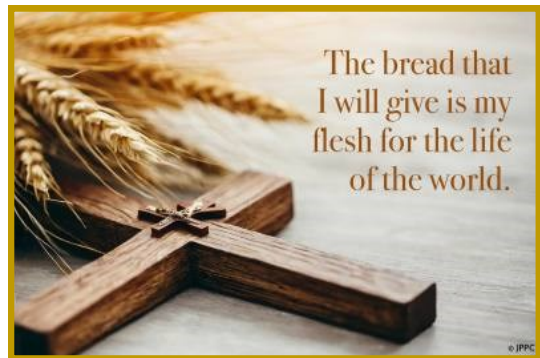

Dear Friends,

A popular hobby these days is searching for one's ancestors. You might know of the hit show about it on Public TV. Why the popularity? Many reasons, I'm sure. But one of them is that our ancestors establish our place in the lineup of history. Who is ahead of us in the human procession God continues to form?

Obviously, this subject was a primary interest of Jesus' contemporaries. So, when He stepped out of the ordinary by the things He said about His ancestry, His listeners perked up with questions. The cynics among them took aim. Our Gospel section from St. John tells us that Jesus ignored the latter and went on to talk about Himself as the "Bread of life." He reminded them about one certainty in this life: eating the miraculous manna in no way prevented their deaths. He was telling them about a certain holy bread that would.

Joining this gospel with our First Reading from the Book of Kings we detect the theme of life as a journey. We often ignore that fact, especially when we're young. Most of the time we focus on the here and now. Just after breakfast we might wonder "What's for dinner?"

Readers of the Bible, at any age, know better. We are journeying to somewhere, and it's just on the other side of our death. Logically, we know that for any journey to be successful we humans need nourishment. So, the smart road traveler has food and drink packed and ready. But what do we pack enroute to eternity? We believers in Jesus know for sure that He has provided both for us in the incomparable Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist.

The modern world has a big problem accepting as true anything which the 5 senses do not deliver to our minds. So much for the existence of angels, for example, which Our Lord surely acknowledged. What He said and did at the Last Supper, replacing the substance of a piece of bread and a cup of wine, and making it easily available to us, is both Gift and Guide for our journey.

Baseball great Yogi Berra once warned, "If you don't know where you're going, you'll wind up somewhere else." The logic may appear muddled, but the truth is clear. Unless we have a positive, worthwhile goal, life can become a series of wrong turns and dead ends. Our Church's saints, our ancestors in the Faith, knew this. Try to learn their stories, and choose a few favorites, so you too will know the way home. Home, that is, to Heaven.

God love you, as He walks with you on your journey.

Readings of the Week

Reading I : 1 Kings 19:4-8

The angel of the Lord came back to him.

- Elijah, discouraged and fearing for his life, flees into the desert and prays for death.
- God's answer to his prayer echoes the Exodus and desert experience of Israel.
- Though he is discouraged and desperate when he flees into the desert, Elijah is transformed by the bread and water sent from God.

Reading II : Ephesians 4:30-5:2

Live in love.

- Today's passage describes the undeniable love that Christ has shown.
- Paul reminds the Ephesians that they share in new life with God.
- Christ gave his life for love of us; we must in turn show love to our neighbor.

Gospel : John 6:41-51

No one can come to me unless my Father draws him or her.

- Those who hear Jesus describe himself as "bread from heaven", murmur about Jesus being the Bread of Life.
- This echoes Israel murmuring in the desert about food and water and leadership.
- The difference between manna and Jesus is that those who ate the manna died, but those who eat the Bread of Life will live forever.

Family Reflection Corner

Theme: Jesus the Living Bread

Suggested text for faith sharing: Today's Gospel

Step One: Listen to the Word

As you hear this reading, what words or phrases strike you? How do these words of Jesus touch your heart? What single line remains in your memory?

Step Two: Look into Your Life

Question for Children: Name one way that your faith nourishes you? How does it help your life?

Question for Youth: Bread nourishes us physically, and Jesus as the living bread nourishes spiritually. How can you be more open to Jesus and the ways that he can feed you?

Question for Adults: What nourishes your life? What does the phrase "living bread" mean for you?

Saint Apollinaris, Bishop and martyr, d. c. 79AD: Feast Day is July 20

Apollinaris is said to be a native of Antioch and a follower of Saint Peter. He is said to have traveled with Saint Peter from Antioch where, sometime later, Peter ordained him as bishop and sent him to Ravenna. Soon after his arrival, Apollinaris performed his first miracle when a Centurion asked him to cure his son who was blind. When Apollinaris made the sign of the cross on the boy's eyes, his sight was instantly restored. Word of this miracle spread quickly through the city and, a day or so later, another senior Roman officer sought him out and asked him to cure his wife's long standing illness. This he did.

Word of his miracles brought many people to Apollinaris for instruction and, soon, a Christian community was flourishing in the city. To serve this growing community, the bishop ordained priests and deacons. Sometime later, during the reign of the emperor Vespasian, Apollinaris was arrested and was exiled to Illyria (present day Croatia). During his exile he was tutored and died from this treatment in the year 79AD.

Saint Apollinaris is the patron of those suffering from gout and epilepsy

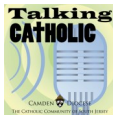

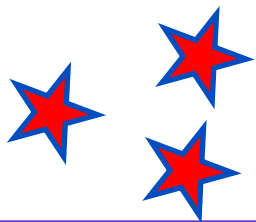

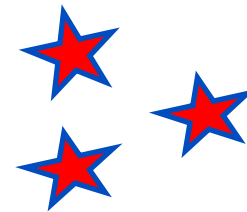
