

From the Desk of Fr. César - Parochial Vicar

Is the Common Good my Business?

My Dear Parishioners,

Today there is a lot of controversy over decisions that are being made for the common good. There are questions around vaccinations, around the environment (especially climate change), responsibility to other countries (an example would be Afghanistan, China) and religious freedom which is under attack in the public sphere. To care about these issues does not mean that you are a communist or even a socialist. Our Church has clear teachings when it comes to social issues and the issues that are mentioned are under the common good.

As Americans we are constantly reminded of the separation of God and the state. Does this separation mean that the state is not influenced by the teachings of God? If we do allow God to influence everyday life in society, does this mean that we are trying to form a theocracy? Throughout history, the Church has been in the front of serving the common good. Look at the hospital system, the universities in the world, scientists that studied genetics or the stars and planets. Music, art and plays have all been directly affected by the Church. How poor the world would be without the faith. Museums would be empty! The world would be even poorer than it already is.

We learned in our catechism as children that there are corporal and spiritual works of mercy. We are taught that living out our baptism is, for example, feeding the hungry, clothing the naked and burying the dead. On the spiritual level, it is right to admonish the sinner and to comfort the sorrowful. Charity calls us to put our love for God into action. The unbeliever's heart is so often moved, not out of love of God, but because by our very nature, most people are compassionate and abhor seeing another suffer. When we are charitable, it when we are most human. This parish is so charitable in your generosity to the Lazarus House, which allows volunteers to give food and shelter to not only our parishioners in need, but to help the stranger in our midst. As a parish family, we can find ways to truly be charitable to the elderly, the homebound, the sick and the poor in spirit.

Friends, we hear the word "justice," which can mean many different things to people. For some, justice is the law, or it might seem like retribution for a crime committed. No, justice is giving a person what is their due as a human being (for the believer, everyone is a child of God). As human beings, we must serve others with our time, money, effort, and prayer. We do it because we recognize that as children of God, we share in His dignity not because of our merit but because of His generosity.

If Jesus tells us to love one another, how is this possible if we do not know the person intimately or at all? Love is to desire that person's good and to put into action ways to bring about good in people's lives. I know that it is difficult to love our enemies. We know that there are times that we feel taken advantage of, but it is not permissible to love only those we like.

The essential thing is that we keep in mind the common good without losing who we are individually. As the world becomes ever more global, news, including errors travel very quickly today. Pope Benedict titled his important encyclical on charity: Caritas in veritate or love in truth. We must support our government in doing good works for her people, but the Church must also be sure to keep ethical standards on the mind of everything that is done for others. As Catholics we must speak up and play our part on every level of society. While we clergy are called by the Church to refrain becoming involved in politics, the pastors have a voice on ethical matters and must truly speak up to give you, the faithful, the understanding and tools to influence all society, even the political.

My friends, do not be afraid of the truth. We must remember that we have not only faith, but reason as well. Yes, there is a separation of Church and state, but this does not mean that the Church must be quiet. We cannot have it both ways, when for example the Church is criticized for not speaking out against the Nazi holocaust, but then if we speak out on issues of life, we are told to be silent. It does not make sense. No, even with the faults of individuals in the Church, including her pastors, we must speak the truth for as Jesus reminds us, "The truth will set you free." There are many untruths that are being offered to the world. Our young people are being hit with confusing messages every day and the greatest act of charity is to give the truth to someone. We can bandage the wounded and pray for the sick, but if we are offering confusion and even lies to people, we are giving them poison rather than the medicine of love.

Yes, aiming to assist the common good is Catholic teaching and is not something that should be feared because of a misguided desire to stay out of other people's business. We can encourage the rich to share what they are blessed to have and do not need to be called communist or socialist. While it is wrong to take from someone what they have earned, even if they are very successful, so it is wrong to hoard what we have and refuse to help our brother or sister in need.

The Lord Jesus told us that "Whatever we do to the least of our brothers, we do unto Him." In our time when we have seen lockdowns, anonymity through masks and a lack of social touch, we must not allow anything to stop us from seeking ways to put our love for Jesus into action. Society was already on a track that had each person fading into anonymity and being forgotten. The homeless person must be stepped over and the beggar should get a job. We must do all we can for the common good as Mother Church teaches. The Church has the charity of truth and you as baptized disciples can proclaim this truth with your charity towards the common good. Charity without truth is a lie; a lie proclaimed without truth is a lie. There can never be a lockdown from charity!

May the Lord bless the good works that you do in His name!

LITURGY CORNER

What is meant by Discernment

When we hear the word discernment, we tend to think about the discernment of vocations. You might discern the religious life; you might discern marriage; you might discern a different vocation entirely. This process is important, and it is infinitely helpful to spend time in prayer and discernment before making any big life decision. But what about the little decisions that we face every day? Should we discern those, too?

St. Ignatius of Loyola, founder of the Society of Jesus, developed the Spiritual Exercises to help us discern the “motions of the soul” so that we can understand what spirits are moving us, and why. Then, we can figure out how to respond to these movements. This kind of discernment can happen every day of our lives, with each decision we make. It does not matter how big or small the decision is—every choice we make gives us the opportunity to grow closer to God.

What does this mean in our everyday spiritual life? For each spiritual decision you make, identify what you are naturally inclined to do, and reflect on where that inclination comes from. Will your inclination bring you closer to God, or will it start to put up walls in your relationship? For example, think about your daily prayer and why you might feel inclined to shorten or lengthen it. Reflect on a volunteer opportunity at your parish and your motivations for taking it or not taking it. In everything that is tied to your relationship with God, listen carefully to what God is telling you.

This can be challenging in a fast-paced life where decisions are expected on the spot. It can be tempting to follow our initial inclinations without fully discerning our motivations or the motions of the soul. Pray, at Mass and in silence before the Blessed Sacrament, for the guidance and patience to discern the actions that will bring us closer to God.
