

## Saint of the Week:

Gregory the Great, Pope and Doctor, 540-604

Best known in this age, perhaps, for the chants that take his name, Pope Gregory contributed much to the Church besides a music form. Born and raised in a patrician family at a time when the Roman Empire was disintegrating, Gregory received the best education available in Rome and began his career as a public official. Gregory felt a higher calling, however, and eventually left civil service to devote himself to God. Gregory was ordained and served in different roles. He was elected pope, and consecrated pope on September 3, 590.

As pope, Gregory introduced many reforms in the Church, and preached often on the scriptural readings of the day. Many of his homilies still exist. In addition to the many sermons and letters that he wrote, in 593, he published *Dialogues*, a collection of tales of visions, prophecies, and miracles gathered from oral tradition. This was one of the most popular books of the middle ages.

Gregory was an ideal landlord according to Alban Butler. He directed his overseers to treat his vassals and farmers with charity, His many charitable gifts saved multitudes from starvation in these stressful times.

Gregory was canonized a saint by acclamation almost immediately after his death. For all of his works, only a few of which have been mentioned here, he has been called St. Gregory the Great. He is the patron of singers. We celebrate his Feast Day on September 3.
