

From the Desk of Deacon Nick Danze, Pastoral Associate

Dear parishioners,

Today we are being asked to answer the following question; do we value present day joy...and the way of the world...over eternal happiness?

My friends, Jesus made a bold declaration to anyone who wants to be his Disciple. He said, "if you want to come after me you must deny yourself and take up your cross and follow me."

The story has been told of a man who constantly complained about the size of the cross he had been called to bear. He was convinced that he had it more difficult in life than anybody. If only he could talk to God face to face about the situation. His complaining began to get on heaven's nerves.

Finally, an angel came down and took him to heaven. Look, all you do is complain about the size of your cross. Come into the room of crosses and choose which one you want to bear. Seeing crosses of all sizes, he pointed to the small cross. The angel said, "are you sure that's the cross you want?" The man replied, look you don't know what I've been through. I'm not carrying any of these large crosses.

The angel said that the only reason he asked whether he was sure that that was the cross he wanted is because that's the cross he had before he got here.

Unfortunately, many of us misunderstand what it is to take up the cross. So today we are being challenged to fight the temptation to take care of number one, to remain in our own self-centeredness. In fact, to do so, we have to take steps to deny ourselves for the sake of the kingdom of God. My friends, the way of sacrificial love is the acceptance of the cross and be willing to pay the price not for ourselves but for others.

You see, for Jesus it meant going to a cross because he loved us so much he could do nothing else. For us it means reaching out to people who are unlovable and who may never return the love. And yet we are to keep on loving because that's what Jesus did. It is hard, I know, to love people who live in a different world than we do, those who hate us. And yet cross bearing means that.

My friends, Jesus offers us a cross not a life of ease. Let's have the courage...indeed be willing to pay the price...step out of our world and embrace it, or can it be that the values and ways of the world...stand in our way?

May God our father give you grace and peace!





Saint of the Week:

Helen, mother, c.250-c.330

As with many saints of this era of the Church, many conflicting stories of Helen's life exist. Where most accounts agree is that Helen (or Helena) was married to Constantius Chlorus and was the mother of Constantine the Great. Constantine called Helen to the royal court and conferred on her the title of Augusta. Under the influence of her son, Helen embraced Christianity and spent the remainder of her life working to spread Christianity. Among her good works were the construction of several churches in Rome and other cities in the Western Roman Empire. Her charities were also especially compassionate toward the poor of the empire.

Traveling to the Holy Land, Helen followed the footsteps of Jesus and then had two churches constructed in Bethlehem at the Grotto of the Nativity and at the Mount of the Ascension near Jerusalem. Her group also found the cross on which Christ died, together with the crosses that held the thieves. Uncertain as to which was the true cross, Helen consulted St. Macarius. This saint suggested that she take the crosses to a woman who was suffering from an incurable disease. Touching each cross in turn, the woman was immediately healed when she touched the true cross. This event is celebrated on September 14, the feast of The Exaltation of the Holy Cross.

St. Helen is the patron of archeologists, converts, divorced people, and the diocese of Helena, Montana. In many places in the Western Church, this saint is honored on **August 18**.
