From the desk of Scott & Kathy Woodside, Respect Life Ministry

Dear Parishioners,

Sometimes life doesn't turn out the way you may have thought it would. The saying if you want to hear God laugh tell Him your plans, that pretty much sums up our navigation of this thing you call life. God the author of life often draws with crooked lines and sometimes we want to pick up the pen to pretty up our story, but He always knows what is best for us. We just need to follow the plan.

We had our first son when we were 18. It was exciting and awe inspiring, but also intimidating and a bit scary. There were many challenges ahead for us, but God is good, and we were given the love and support we needed to thrive. Just six months before our oldest son's birth, Scott's mother lost her three-year battle with cancer at age 50. As an only child being raised by a single mother and caring for her while in his teens was not something he thought much about at the time, but looking back now he could see that God was using this very difficult time to allow him to grow in virtue, if only he would cooperate with His graces.

Now, almost fifty years later, we have been blessed with two sons and their families, including five grandchildren who are between the ages of 12 and 22 years old. Kathy's parents are now in their late eighties and have many health issues. But even with their daily struggles they still make Sunday Mass a priority. They care for each other as best as they are able and as a family, we all pitch in where we are needed.

During the month of October, we celebrate the Respect of Life from the womb to the tomb and give thanks to God for our many blessings, including the gift of our families, from the oldest to the youngest. In Genesis chapter one we read that God created man and women in His own image. In the first reading today, we see how God values families and elevates marriage to a sacrament. The Catechism of the Catholic Church says that in our human family, "it's members are persons equal in dignity." We live in an age where the Respect of Life is so degraded, you only need to watch the news for a front row view of this disrespect. Your help is needed more now than ever to care for those in need, especially the unborn, the poor and the elderly. We are called to be Christians by our love with our time, talents and treasure but mostly with our daily prayers, for the unborn who are at risk now more than ever in history.

Here at Notre Dame de la Mer parish we have a small but active Respect Life Ministry. We sponsor many activities and events throughout the year to provide awareness and to educate others on legislation, needs of the community to support pregnancy crisis centers and those in need with basic necessities to support young families and the elderly. The Respect Life Ministry meets in the Saint Joseph Room on the first Monday of each month and all are welcome to become part of the team. All the information is in the bulletin each week and we hope to see some of you on Tuesday after the 8:30 Mass.

Readings of the Week

Reading I: Genesis 2:18-24

I will make a partner for him.

- The creation story in Genesis 2 portrays God as searching for an equal partner for the human.
- Only a creature that shares the same flesh will be a fitting partner.
- The union between man and woman is so central that they long to reunite in the one flesh they share.

Reading II: Hebrews 2:9-11

They are all brothers.

- In Jesus we see the true nature of God.
- Today's second reading points out that Jesus accepted death for the sake of all.
- Jesus is the perfect leader because he shared in our weakness and suffering.

Gospel: Mark 10:2-16

Let the children come to me.

- In response to the Pharisees question about divorce, Jesus compares the passage in Deuteronomy, which is simply a concession to human weakness, to the creation story in Genesis, which emphasizes the indissolubility of marriage.
- Jesus presents the ideal of the marriage bond to stress the truth that in him, sin has no power in the world.
- In the final passage of today's Gospel, Jesus proclaims that the kingdom belongs to those who receive it as children.



On October 12, at 9am following morning Mass, for the Fourth year in a row, Notre Dame de la Mer will be part of the nationwide Rosary process, celebrating that "America needs Fatima."



Saint of the Week:

Marie Rose Durocher, Religious, 1811-1849

Eulalie Durocher was born in St. Antoine, Quebec, on October 6, 1811. While little is known of her early life, it can be assumed from what she accomplished in her relatively short lifetime that she received an excellent education. During the years that she served in her parish, Eulalie became very aware of the shortcomings in the education of the children, especially the girls.

Knowing Eulalie's concern for the education of children, her confessor, Fr. Pierre Telmon, with the concurrence of Bishop Bourget, urged her to start such a teaching order. Although reluctant due to her poor health, Eulalie agreed and, together with two companions, founded the Sisters of the Holy Name of Jesus and Mary.

Eulalie and her companions took their vows as religious in December 1844. Eulalie took the name Marie Rose at that time as she became the superior of the order. This small congregation with three sisters grew quite rapidly as other women, recognizing the need, joined them. Mother Marie Rose did not have the opportunity to see most of this growth. Always sickly, Marie Rose died on October 6, 1849. On her death bed, she was heard to repeatedly recite the prayer, "Jesus, Mary, Joseph! Sweet Jesus, I love you. Jesus, be to me Jesus!" With one of her sisters by her side, she smiled at the sister and said to her, "Your prayers are keeping me here—let me go."


