

From the Desk of Kevin Quinn - Parish Administrator

Dear Parishioner,

This week the bulletin contains the annual financial report for fiscal year 2021-2022, that is July 1, 2021 – June 30, 2022. I must say that it was a much better year than 2020 – 2021. Throughout the year we have continued to see that the weekly giving has increased not only over the past year, but also when comparing to 2019. This is a great trend and we believe it affirms our suspicion that church attendance is also improving.

One of the most important responsibilities of parish administration is the sharing of the financial activity of the parish with you. It is always the goal of parish leadership to be transparent when it comes to the finances of this parish. On pages 10 and 11 of this bulletin you will find a report that includes graphics and figures showing the expense and income breakdown for the 2021 - 2022 fiscal year, per the operating budget. Please note that this is not a balance sheet discussing all parish assets and liabilities. In addition to the expense and income breakdown you will also find a few other bits of information highlighting the year. This includes sacramental numbers and ministry involvement, Catholic Strong Information, and an important realization, our annual utility costs. Despite our best efforts utility and energy costs continue to rise.

As you know, stewardship encompasses much more than the generation of revenue. It is that call to each of us to support our parish in all ways possible. Stewardship draws upon the talents, expertise, and hard work of parishioners. Stewardship is not only a way to give back to the parish, it also is the best way to become involved, to meet people, and to feel a part of our Catholic community. I encourage you to make a commitment to be actively involved in the parish through all three of the following: attending and participating in Mass, providing financial support, and offering time and talent as service to the parish community. We have a great number of ministries, both old and new, for you to become involved with. This past year we witnessed incredibly satisfying growth in a few new ministries and opportunity for spiritual growth.

As always, there are maintenance issues that must be addressed, especially in our aging worship spaces. The projects are staggered and our resources from Operating, Savings, and Catholic Strong are used to address them. This past year we addressed some of the recurring maintenance items that you could expect, HVAC, painting, plumbing and electric. We also addressed an issue with the drainage system and subsequent roof damage on the flat roof at St. Ann Church. Our complete overhaul of the sound systems and replacement of the organs in both St. Ann Church and Assumption Church are almost complete. You surely have noticed a difference.

Wildwood Catholic Academy completed its second year. The school is a mission of our parish. Therefore, it is our responsibility to help it succeed. Enrollment numbers were slightly larger than what was budgeted. This is a positive. We established a new school board that will continue to take shape and grow. They join our very involved school finance council in guiding and advising the school leadership team. We continue to need your support and prayers to help us make this PreK – 12 entity, the first in the Diocese of Camden, a success. The third year (2022-2023) is shaping up to be fantastic.

In addition to the quantitative data listed here, I gratefully acknowledge the generous efforts of hundreds of parish volunteers, who over the past year, have contributed thousands of hours to support our parish and its various ministries and activities. Our volunteers play a vital role in helping our parish live its mission and help to keep all of the facets of our extremely active parish running smoothly. I would also like to thank the Parish Council and Parish Finance Committee for all of its guidance.

I hope that you have a chance to look over the report in the bulletin and if you have any questions please don't hesitate to come see me.

Readings of the Week

Reading I: 2 Kings 5:14-17

Thank God for the good things he does for you.

- The story from the Second Book of Kings is part of the Elijah-Elisha cycle of prophetic legends.
- When Naaman came to Elisha to request a cure, Elisha sent him to wash seven times in the Jordan River.
- Naaman's physical cure becomes the basis of faith in the God of Israel.

Reading II: 2 Timothy 2:8-13

There is no chaining the word of God!

- Today's reading from the Second Letter of Paul to Timothy continues the series of exhortations for ministers of the gospel.
- Those who suffer hardships with Christ and for him, who die and are faithful to the end with him, will live with Christ in the kingdom.


