From the desk of Jonathan Delgado, Director of Music and Liturgy-

Dear Parishioner.

As the season of autumn is moving right along ever so quickly with Thanksgiving soon approaching, so is our liturgical calendar with today being the Thirty-second Sunday in ordinary time. As we continue to remember all those who have gone before us during the month of November it is especially important to pray for the souls in Purgatory as they cannot pray for themselves. Our prayers can console them in their suffering and help shorten their time there. Therefore, we should continue to pray for our deceased family members and friends for the rest of our lives. Our prayers will either assist them if they need it, or assist other souls if the people we are praying for are already in Heaven. I like to think that the people we pray for know that we pray for them and it is another way we can stay close to them until we are hopefully, one day reunited in Heaven.

While it is important to pray for them all year, having a month dedicated to them gives us a special awareness of their presence in the Church, and their need for our prayers. I like that the entire Church is united in praying together for the souls of all who have died. I think this time of remembering everyone who has died can also bring consolation to people who are mourning. I experienced this consolation myself when my mother died in 2018. After my mother had passed away, I found it very comforting that the Church would be praying for her and all the departed souls during the whole month of November, I can still remember bringing her picture to our annual All Soul's Remembrance Mass and felt that the other members of the Church were united with me in prayer and it made me feel I was not alone. I really think that this special month of November was very helpful to me as I grieved. My mother may be in heaven now; nevertheless, I pray for her every day and arrange for Masses to be offered for her.

One of the corporal works of mercy is to bury the dead and one of the spiritual works of mercy is to pray for the living and the dead. We can do these works of mercy by praying for the poor souls, arranging for Masses to be offered, offering up our suffering, and offering up sacrifices for them –not only in the month of November, but throughout the year.

Two weeks from this Sunday we will end another Liturgical Year with the Solemnity of our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe and begin a new Liturgical Year with the First Sunday of Advent. Knowing that Advent is just around the corner our Music Ministry has already begun preparations for our annual Christmas Concert entitled "A Prelude to Christmas" to be held on Sunday December 15th, 6:00pm at The Church of the Assumption. Our Adult, Contemporary and Children's Choirs will all be performing and accompanied by many instrumentalists which will lead to the concerts finale, the story of the Holy Nativity which will be brought to life in the Sanctuary by the youth of our parish. Please mark your calendars for this very special night for our parish. More details will follow in the weeks to come. For now let us keep enjoying this beautiful autumn season and Ordinary Time in the church.

Martin de Porres, Religious 1579-1639

Martin was the illegitimate son of a Spanish knight and a freed Panamanian slave. Born and raised in Lima, Peru, he was part of the poorest and lowest level of society. As a young man, Martin applied to the Dominicans to be a "lay-helper" because he didn't himself feel worthy to be a religious brother. He often spent his nights in prayer, while his days were filled with caring for the sick and the poor. He founded an orphanage and looked after the slaves brought from Africa. After nine years, his example of prayer and penance, charity and humility, led his religious community to ask Martin to make a full religious profession.



WCA is pleased to announce: The Sister St. Gervase Memorial Scholarship

Through the generosity of our former, long-time, esteemed English teacher, William (Bill) Waters, several students have been granted a scholarship in honor of Sister St. Gervase, SSJ, which has assisted them in attending Wildwood Catholic Academy. The Sisters of St. Joseph of Philadelphia is the religious order of sisters that, for many decades, was the heart and soul of Wildwood Catholic. One of the many marvelous nuns who taught at Wildwood Catholic was Sister St. Gervase, who was assigned to Wildwood Catholic from September 1978 until June 1983. Sadly, she died on September 17, 2020. Because of Covid-19, Sister's obituary was not widely published and her funeral was private. Below is the Obituary printed several months after her passing in The Order's newsletter:

Sister St. Gervase Glackin went home to God on September 17, 2020, two weeks after her 91st birthday. A resident of St. Joseph Villa since 2014, Sister's liturgy and funeral followed at the Villa on September 22.

The second oldest of seven children, Mary Angela, lost her father when she was just eight years old. Her mother, Mary Glackin, wanted a good education for the young children and enrolled six of the children in St. Joseph Academy in McSherrytown, PA, a boarding school owned by the Sisters of St. Joseph. The youngest Glackin child, Charles, remains.

Strongly influenced by the spirit and dedication of the Sisters at the Academy, young Mary Angela entered the Novitiate in September 1946. Her first ministry, teaching elementary school children in various grades, schools and dioceses, lasted for twenty years. Subsequent ministry in secondary education allowed her to share her love for reading and writing and to introduce them to authors, especially English writers. She often accompanied groups of students to London where they, too, enjoyed all things British.

Summers also allowed Sister to pursue opportunities for offering volunteer services in New York and even in California, in various capacities.

Her ministry, later on, included teaching college students, including stints at Drexel and Villanova Universities and Community College of Philadelphia. In 2002, Sister St. Gervase became coordinator of Outreach at St. John Church in Philadelphia before accepting an invitation to assist students with reading and writing skills in the English department at Neumann-Goretti High School.

After a brief time volunteering at Mount Saint Joseph Convent, Sister St. Gervase took up residence at the Villa, often sharing readings of published poets. She enjoyed writing her own poems for special occasions and shared them as well. Truly a unique and creative spirit, St. Gervase will be fondly remembered.

Sister St. Gervase left a lasting impression on many of the over 600 Wildwood Catholic students she encountered during her five academic years spent laboring at the school. She was an inspired teacher of British literature and writing skills and started Wildwood Catholic's very first AP course (AP English Literature and Composition). She held "high tea" for her students at the convent, donned special attire to confer knighthood on famous British writers from the past, and took students and some parents on literary trips to England. To quote one of her English department colleagues, "Her life was marked by exuberance in the classroom and a passion for service in the outside world."

To honor the memory of Sister St. Gervase, the following AP English Language and Composition students have been awarded a scholarship: Rebecca Arcuri, Jenna DiFazio, Azucena Martinez Panesso, Ava Richards

Our thanks to Mr. Waters for sponsoring this generous scholarship in memory of Sister St. Gervase. May Sister's love of all things "English" and her passion for service be an inspiration to our students.
