Family Reflection Corner

Weekly Readings Reflection

33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Choose one of the following activities as a way to further reflect on the Sunday readings.

- The Gospel today asks us to use our gifts and risk everything for the sake of the Gospel. Give a cardboard circle to each member of the family. Instruct each person to write his or her name on a circle and then to pass the circle to the person on the left. This person should write on the circle one gift that the family member has. If the children are too young to write, do this orally while someone in the family writes. Take time to affirm the talents you see in one another. Talk about ways to use your gifts to help build God’s Kingdom.
- Explore the service opportunities available in your community. Discuss with your family ways that you can use your gifts to make life better for someone less fortunate.
- Discuss with your family what risks you can take this week to spread the Gospel values to those we meet in our everyday life.

November, the month of giving thanks, offers many opportunities to share our blessings and gifts with others.

Reflections on *Mysterium Fidei* by Pope Paul VI

Sections 46-55

In this section, Paul VI focuses primarily on the doctrine of transubstantiation. Transubstantiation is "the conversion of the whole substance of the bread into his body and of the whole substance of the wine into his blood" (MF 46). This teaching is primarily a philosophical and theological concept. The Church Fathers emphasized this teaching in their works and sermons. Paul VI focuses on Saint Cyril of Jerusalem, Saint John Chrysostom, St Cyril of Alexandria, and St Ambrose. It seems consistent that the Fathers tell us not to pay attention to the senses but rather to the words of Christ. St. Ambrose's teaching on this eucharistic conversion emphasizes the power of Christ when he says, "surely the word of Christ, who could make something that did not exist out of nothing, can change things that do exist into something they were not before" (MF51). Paul VI also mentions the constant teaching of transubstantiation through the popes and Church Councils. St. Gregory VII, when dealing with someone who denied the substantial change of bread and wine, desired that he profess that the bread we eat is "the true and proper in life giving flesh and blood of Jesus Christ our Lord ... Which was born of the Virgin in which hung on the cross as an offering for the Salvation of the world" or risk excommunication (MF 52).

I believe the word to describe Gregory VII's profession of transubstantiation would be dramatic. As dramatic as it may be, it nonetheless speaks the truth of such a beautiful teaching. The Eucharistic host we adore during the Mass is the same Jesus the Blessed Virgin Mary carried in her womb and saw die on the cross. It is the same corpse that appeared to the women after the Resurrection. Through the mystical change, Christ calls us to enter into the mystery and to be witnesses to his Paschal Mystery.

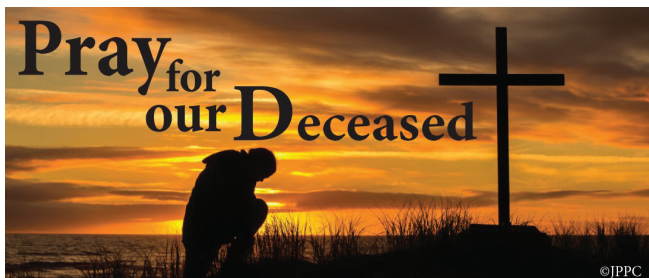

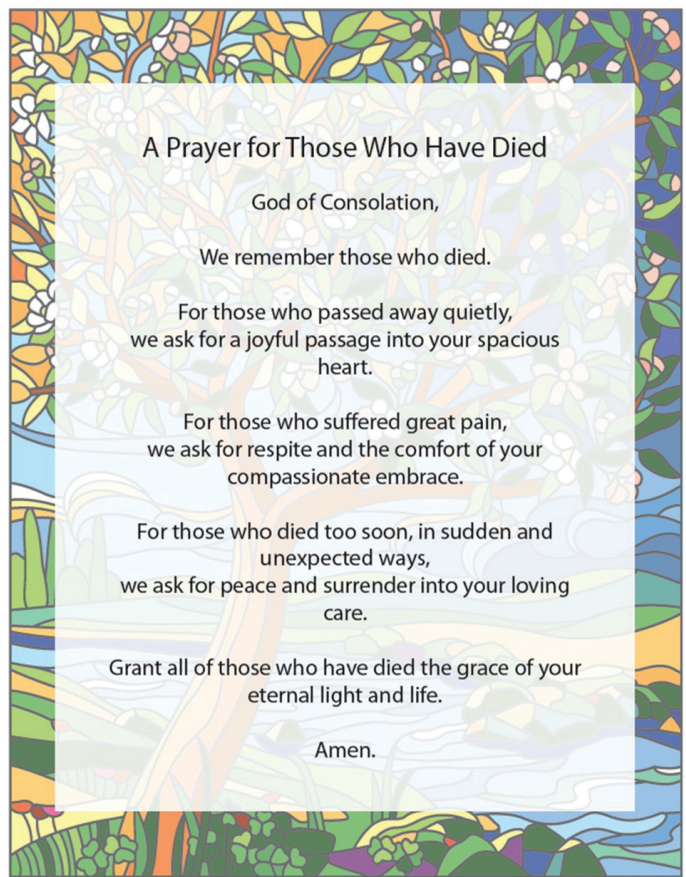
Book of the Dead

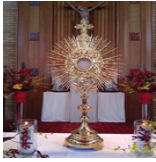

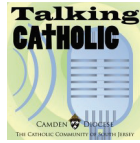

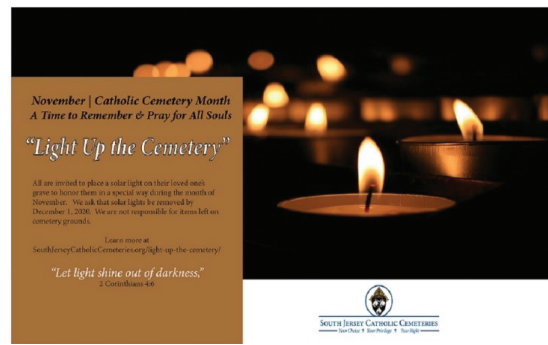


The new safe environment training program for adults is **VIRTUS® Protecting God's Children.**
