Dear Friends,

In human freedom we find ourselves within the laws of the universe. All humanity, in a reflection on freedom, find that they are limited by nature. There is a certain restriction or boundary within the structure of the existence of the human being, and all living and non-living beings as well (besides God). Therefore, persons can come to the conclusion of the natural law - which 'refers to the use of reason to analyze human nature to arrive at binding rules of moral behavior' that are constant in and through every age.

In today's modern society, it seems we tend to see law as an external constraint and a limitation of liberty. This thought process believes the two are in a continuous battle or confrontation. Hence the law is seen as something which controls or suppress the freedom of the individual within the society. Perhaps this is true with some unjust laws, but most laws 'are promulgated by a rational authority, who is in charge of the community seeking the common good'. Law engages our rational facilities to help grasp the truth about the good in a community and moves us beyond our own egoism. Thus leading us from a sense of radical independence, to the reality of human existence - interdependence.

The Church, as a society has laws governing God's people, and has a beautiful comprehension of law and liberty. According to St. Thomas Aquinas, 'Law is a necessary aid in the development of liberty. It cooperates with the attraction for the truth and goodness that is within liberty. Law is particularly needed in the first stage of education; in time it is progressively interiorized due to the virtues of justice and charity'. Here we notice 'it generates a vision of morals based upon the attraction of truth and goodness, on the desire of happiness'; not on restriction for the sake of control or to suppress our freedom. Law properly speaking, moves the whole community into an 'authentic autonomy', for it helps us to internalize the true good and act according to our deepest desire - which is to be a saint! In this engagement, law seeks to lead all acting subjects into a state of 'genuine being', participating fully in their rational capacity... In the end, the more the law becomes internalized, we realize we are not under the restraint of law, but under grace - the support of God sanctifying our whole being...






