From the Desk of Fr. César - Parochial Vicar

The Season of Advent is a time for repentance and to prepare to celebrate the birth of Our Savior. Holy Mother Church invites us to live the season of advent in a very intense way. The Advent season calls us to offer our hearts to the heart of Christ, not in a superficial and superfluous way but rather profoundly and purposefully. A great theme of this season is God welcoming us and guiding us along hope filled paths that help us to discover our dignity as children of God.

The world, the flesh, and the devil get in the way of seeing our dignity given to us as a gift. We must discover this gift of our dignity because; we must spend time in prayer so that any attempts to divert us from the path of Christ will be avoided. If we are not careful, we can despise the gift that is given to us and lose the sense of our dignity before God. Thus, we are encouraged to be watchful and vigilant!

The world bombards us with misinformation and constant noise, which only stuns us, keeping us from any deep reflection. The flesh and its passions can blind us if we are not guided by reason. The devil tempts us, seduces us with his lies, and only seeks the destruction of our souls. These are the enemies of the soul and of Christ. The Incarnation and birth of Jesus is not merely a sentimental event that we look at in admiration from afar, but instead, the Lord invites us to follow Him, take up our cross and discover in Him the whole meaning of the human being in relation to the Holy Trinity Who has created us with a single purpose, eternal happiness with God. In other words, the Baby Jesus came to save us to lead us to the Father!

Someone exceptional in our lives is the Blessed Virgin Mary. One of the great saints of the Church, Saint Maximilian Kolbe, OFM, warns us about thinking that the times in which we live are easy for the modern disciple of Christ: "Modern times are dominated by Satan and will be more so in the future. Men, even the most clever, cannot engage in conflict with hell. The Immaculate alone has from God the promise of victory over Satan. However, assumed into heaven, the Mother of God now requires our cooperation. She seeks souls who will consecrate themselves entirely to her, who will become in her hands effective instruments for the defeat of Satan and the spreading of God's kingdom upon earth." On December 12th, the Church celebrates Our Lady of Guadalupe who left her image in Mexico in 1531. The Aztec culture was immersed in a culture of death, with human sacrifice taking place to "appease the sun." The Mother of God intervened in the history of humanity, seeking an end to the brutal human sacrifice of the most defenseless Aztec society and other indigenous tribes. Thanks to the Divine intervention of God using His Blessed Mother as an instrument, man rediscovered the power of human dignity. It is so similar today with mankind totally losing sight of man made in the image and likeness of God. Our Mother Mary continually leads us to peek into the manger, gaze upon the Infant Jesus, and see the Conqueror of sin and death!

Santa Madre Iglesia nos invita a vivir de manera muy intensa el tiempo de adviento. El tiempo de Adviento nos llama a ofrecer nuestro corazón al corazón de Cristo, no de manera superficial y superflua, sino más bien profunda y decidida. Un gran tema de este tiempo es Dios quien nos acoge y guía por caminos llenos de esperanza que nos ayuden a descubrir nuestra dignidad de hijos de Dios.

El mundo, la carne y el demonio se interponen en el camino de ver nuestra dignidad dada a nosotros como un regalo. Debemos descubrir este don de nuestra dignidad, debemos dedicar tiempo a la oración para así evitar cualquier desvío del camino de Cristo. Si no tenemos cuidado, podemos despreciar el don que se nos da y perder el sentido de nuestra dignidad ante Dios. ¡Por lo tanto, se nos anima a estar atentos y vigilantes!

El mundo nos bombardea con desinformación y ruido constante, que solo nos aturde, alejándonos de cualquier reflexión profunda. La carne y sus pasiones pueden cegarnos si no nos guiamos por la razón. El diablo nos tienta, nos seduce con sus mentiras y solo busca la destrucción de nuestras almas. Estos son los enemigos del alma y de Cristo. La Encarnación y nacimiento de Jesús no es sólo un acontecimiento sentimental que miramos con admiración desde lejos, sino que el Señor nos invita a seguirlo, a tomar nuestra cruz y a descubrir en Él todo el sentido del ser humano en relación con la Santísima Trinidad que nos ha creado con un solo propósito, la felicidad eterna con Dios. En otras palabras, ¡el Niño Jesús vino a salvarnos para llevarnos al Padre!

Alguien excepcional en nuestras vidas es la Santísima Virgen María. Uno de los grandes santos de la Iglesia, San Maximiliano Kolbe, OFM, nos advierte sobre pensar que los tiempos que vivimos son fáciles para el discípulo moderno de Cristo: "Los tiempos modernos están dominados por Satanás y lo estarán más en el futuro. La cultura azteca estaba inmersa en una cultura de muerte, con sacrificios humanos para "apaciguar al sol" La Madre de Dios intervino en la historia de la humanidad, buscando el fin del brutal sacrificio humano de la más indefensa sociedad Azteca y otras tribus indígenas.

Readings of the Week

Reading I: Isaiah 35:1-6a, 10

The desert will rejoice and bloom!

- The prophet Isaiah encourages the Jewish people living in exile in Babylon, to believe that God has the power and the desire to save them.
- The images in the first reading convey new life and hope. This foreshadows what Christians will see in Christ.
- The prophet's message brings comfort to those in need of liberation.

Reading II: James 5:7-10

Be patient.

- The Letter of James urges patience in awaiting the second coming of Christ.
- Just as the farmer needs to be patient, trust God, and cooperate with the natural elements, so must the Christian.
- We are called to wait with patience and to hasten the Kingdom through works of mercy.

Gospel: Matthew 11:2-11

The blind recover their sight, cripples walk, lepers are cured, and deaf hear.

- Today's Gospel describes what kind of Messiah Jesus is.
- By listing his works of healing and restoration in response to John's question, Jesus shows how he fulfills the prophecies of the Old Testament regarding the Messiah, as suggested in today's first reading.
- Jesus identifies John as his forerunner.
