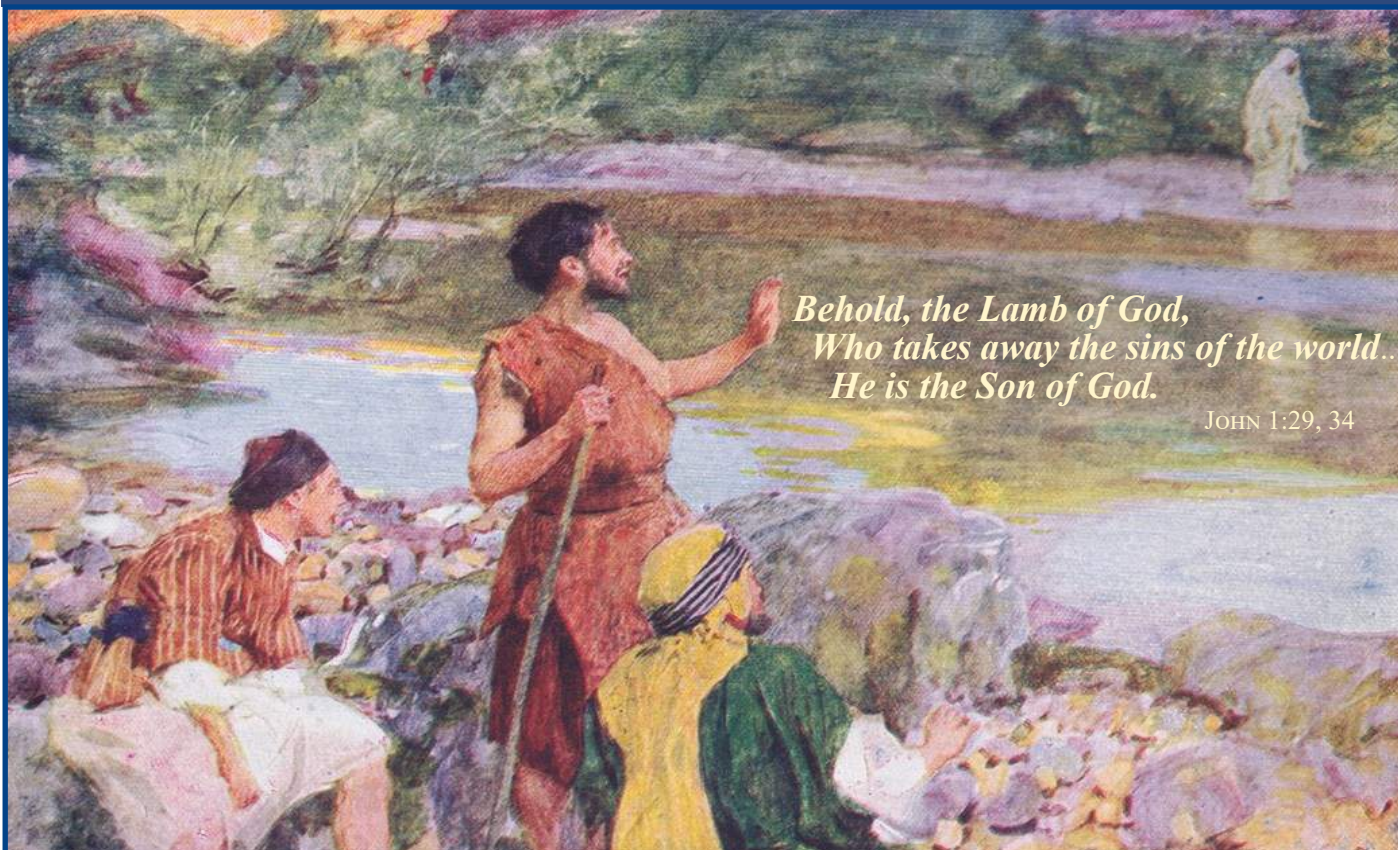

From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

I am so pleased to be able to report to you that our St. Ann Church refurbishment project is expected to start during the week of January 19th. I feel that God is looking kindly on our plans to care for the consecrated St. Ann Church building. I am deeply thankful for the overwhelming faith, generosity, love and sacrifice of so many parishioners and friends of this Parish who have helped to make this possible with their donations, pledges and prayers. But we still are in need of additional funds for updating alarm systems and needed repairs. I have also been advised that, for safety reasons, St. Ann Church must be closed during the work for at least four weeks. So, during the closure, the Saturday 4:30PM Masses, Sunday 10:30AM Masses, and Saturday 3:30-4:15PM Confessions will be at Assumption Church. As we accommodate this change and pray for the project to be completed smoothly and efficiently, let us thank God for blessing this Parish and ask the Holy Spirit to "refurbish," as needed, the worship and service we humbly and lovingly offer in both of our beautiful Church buildings.

From the Desk of Donnamarie Sexton, Parish Catechetical Leader

Dear Friends,

I am excited to be writing the letter this week to tell you about something wonderful happening in our Parish and Catholic School. Next Sunday we begin Catholic Schools Week with a very special Mass. During this Mass seven Wildwood Catholic Academy students will be Baptized. Of these seven students, five are old enough to also receive their First Holy Communion. This is a wonderful tradition that Fr. Mazz started 5 years ago when he came to our Parish. Fr. Mazz meets with every new student in WCA and talks to them about their faith. If they are in need of sacraments, he asks them if they would like to know more about receiving them. If yes, I then call their parents to discuss the possibility of them receiving their sacraments at this Mass or at another time. If they are in our High School and were not Baptized, they receive all of their sacraments and are welcomed into our wonderful faith at the Easter Vigil. This year we have two students who will do just that. In addition to inviting the new students to receive their sacraments we also send a letter home to all of the families at Wildwood Catholic Academy to see if after being here a student now wishes to become Catholic.

Since this tradition has been started, including this year, we have had 50 Baptisms, 39 students receiving Jesus for the first time and 9 students entering the faith at the Easter Vigil. Some of these students come from families who for one reason or another just stopped practicing their faith and through this process have now come back to church. Others come from families who never had any religion or parents who were raised in a different faith and now, because their child came to our wonderful school, they have become Catholic. I have one little girl this year who has made it her mission to evangelize her whole family and get them to church. Every new person she meets she asks if they have been to our beautiful churches.

We have a wonderful School here on the island that is working hard to form children in the Catholic faith and growing our Catholic Church in the process. Please support the School in any way that you can but especially through your prayers.

Reminder, this is the last weekend for Masses in St. Ann Church before it is temporarily closed for refurbishment work. Starting next week all Masses will be at Assumption Church until further notice.

Reflections on the Readings

READING I: Isaiah 49:3, 5-6 — I will make you a light to the nations. To the ends of the earth.

♦ This reading from Isaiah is one of a set of songs which portray a “servant of the Lord,” who was commissioned by God to bring salvation and whose suffering would redeem God’s people. In this passage, the servant is called from the womb and commissioned to bring salvation to the nations. The Evangelists of the New Testament used the figure of the servant to explain the mission of Jesus.

READING II: 1 Corinthians 1:1-3 — Grace and peace of God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

♦ This reading begins Paul’s First Letter to the Corinthians, which will be read for the next several weeks. Paul describes himself as an Apostle, that is, “one who is sent.” Together Paul and the Corinthians form a people “called,” or ecclesia, which we translate as Church.

GOSPEL: John 1:29-34 — Now I have seen for myself.

♦ This Gospel is part of a series of testimonies about the identity of Jesus. John the Baptist identifies Jesus as the Lamb of God and as the Son of God, God’s chosen one. The image of the lamb is rooted in the Passover, the deliverance from Egyptian slavery by God’s saving power, during which Jews sacrificed a lamb putting the blood on the door to commemorate the blood that saved their firstborn from the tenth plague.

Saint of the Week

St. Marianne Cope

1838-1918

St. Marianne Cope was a Franciscan who emulated Saint Francis’ heroic example of personally caring for those outcasts of all outcasts—lepers. She could have developed her abundant talents in many directions and used them for many purposes, but she used what God blessed her with to serve and honor Him, His Church, and humankind. The Church, the Franciscans, New York, and Hawaii were the arenas in which she devoted her skills.

Marianne Cope was born in Germany and was brought to New York State by her parents when she was still a baby. She was the oldest of ten children. Her immigrant parents lived, struggled, and worked hard. She saw generosity in action at home everyday, and practiced it her whole life. She quit school after eighth grade to work in a factory to support her ailing father, her mother, and her many siblings. The challenges inherent to immigration, a new culture, illness, a large family, and poverty turned her into a serious, mature woman when she was just a teen.

At the age of 24, she fulfilled her desire to enter religious life. Once professed, she was moved quickly into leadership positions. She taught in German-speaking Catholic grade schools, became a school principal, and was elected by her fellow Franciscans to positions of governance in her Order. She opened the first hospitals in her region of central New York, dedicating herself and her Order to the caring for the sick regardless of their ability to pay for medical services. She was elected Superior General. In her early forties she was already a woman of wide experience. She was administratively skilled, spiritually grounded, possessing great human capabilities and virtues.

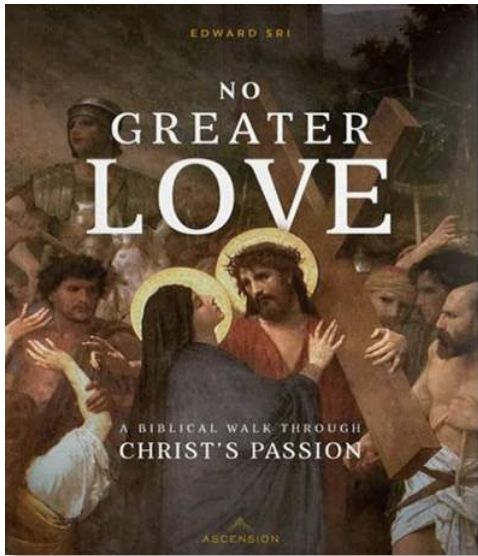
In 1883, she received a letter from the Bishop of Honolulu begging her, as Superior General, to send sisters to care for lepers in Hawaii. He had written to various other religious Orders without success. She was elated. She responded like the prophet Isaiah, saying, “*Here I am, send me*” (Is. 6:8). She not only sent six sisters, she went herself. She planned to return to New York someday but never did.

For thirty-five years, Sr. Marianne Cope lived on remote Hawaii, giving herself completely to the will of God. She and her fellow Franciscans managed one hospital, founded another, opened a home for the daughters of lepers, and, after a few years of proving themselves, opened a home for women and girls on the virtually inaccessible island of Molokai. Her time on that island coincided with the final months of St. Damien de Veuster. She nursed the future saint in his dying days, assuring him that she and her sisters would continue his work among the lepers. After Fr. Damien died, the Franciscan nuns, in addition to caring for the leprous girls, cared for the boys as well until a male Congregation eventually relieved them of this apostolate.

Sr. Marianne Cope lived the last thirty years of her life on Molokai until her death in 1918. She was beatified by Pope Benedict XVI in 2005 and canonized by him in 2012. She loved the Holy Eucharist, the Virgin Mary, and the Church. She loved God foremost — and she loved those whom God loves as her brothers and sisters in Christ. She sacrificed for them, left home and family for them, put her health at risk for them, and became a saint through them.

The Church celebrates the memorial of St. Marianne Cope on January 23.

Why do Christians sing when they are together? The reason is, quite simply, because in singing together it is possible for them to speak and pray the same word at the same time; in other words, because here they can unite in the word. There should be singing.... The more we sing, the more joy will we derive from it, but, above all, the more devotion and discipline and joy we put into our singing, the richer will be the blessing that will come to the whole life of the fellowship from singing together. It is the voice of the church that is heard in singing together. It is not you that sings; it is the church that is singing, and you, as a member of the church, may share in its song. Thus all singing together that is right must serve to widen our spiritual horizon, make us see our little company as a member of the great Christian Church on earth, and help us willingly and gladly to join our singing, be it feeble or good, to the song of the church.
