From Chuck Mirarchi ~ On Eucharistic Adoration

Hello, I am Chuck Mirarchi. I am a Catholic and a parishioner at Notre Dame de la Mer. I am honored and privileged to write about the Eucharist and Adoration toward the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ and His Glorified body. To help us as Catholics, I want to reference the Catechism of the Catholic Church which is our guidebook about Catholic faith. Paragraph #1324 defines the Eucharist as “the source and summit of the Christian life.” That source and summit is the Eucharist, Jesus’ Body and Blood substantially.

Why do we have the need for the Real Presence of God present in the bread and wine? Because God, the Father understands our hunger and need for nourishment, for authentic life. The Eucharist is Jesus’ richest gift; He gives it to us to satisfy that hunger and provide us with His spiritual nourishment.

Jesus by His own words, early in His Ministry, told us He was giving us the food for eternal life. When He gave us the Lord’s Prayer, the “Our Father,” Jesus says, “*Give us this day our DAILY Bread*” (Matthew 6:11)! It is the fourth petition in the prayer. It is petitioning for spiritual and physical nourishment.

In recording the “Our Father,” both Luke’s and Matthew’s Gospels chose to use the Greek word, “Epiousios”! (“*Give us this day our epiousios bread.*”) It is a unique word, used to capture what Jesus said in Aramaic. What is mind-blowing: “Epiousios” occurs nowhere else in the Greek Bible or in Greek literature, except in the Our Father passage in Luke 11:3 and Matthew 6:11. They used it to convey that the bread Jesus was referring to is “super-essential.” They knew it was the Eucharist!

I ask you to ask yourself, was Jesus’ message clear? Have we as Catholics taken it for granted that Jesus died and gave us Himself as the daily Bread? After Jesus’ death and resurrection, His gift of the Eucharist is the greatest gift He could leave for us. He knows us and our senses thrive on seeing, hearing, smelling and, YES, touching and tasting.

The Eucharist is not a symbol. Jesus tells us in John 6:51: “*I am the living bread, who descended from heaven. If anyone eats this bread, he shall live in eternity. And the bread that I give you is my flesh for the life of the world.*”

And Jesus was noticeably clear in his message, doubling down on this claim when he continues to explain in John 6:54-56: “*Amen, Amen I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life in you. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood will have eternal life, and I will raise him up on the last day. For my flesh is true food and my blood is true drink.*”

And Jesus is clear about its redemptive power when instituting the Eucharist during the Last Supper: “*This is my body... this cup is the New Covenant in my blood, which will be shed for you*” (Luke 22:19-20). The Eucharist is the perfect culmination of God’s plan for the redemption of fallen humanity. The Old Testament foretold that it was God’s plan. And Jesus fulfilled His Father’s plan!

Jesus’ gift of the Eucharist was foreshadowed in the Old Testament. As far back as the first book of the Torah, Genesis 14:18 foreshadows the Eucharist: “Melchizedek, king of Salem, brought out bread and wine. He was a priest of God Most High.” Because of who Melchizedek was, this passage clearly points to Christ, His Church, His New Covenant.

In the New Testament, Paul clearly establishes how the apostles and early disciples regarded the Eucharist when he wrote in his first letter to the Church at Corinth: “for whoever eats and drinks unworthily, eats and drinks a sentence against himself, not discerning it to be the body of the Lord (1 Corinthians 11:29).”

Christ’s Last Supper, Passion, brutal beatings and excruciating death, and His giving of His flesh and blood to us in the Eucharist is not to be remembered as a symbol. Jesus had 12 Apostles and 72 disciples who evangelized this. They were to build his Church, Ecclesia. Jesus gave authority to Peter. The Church was to carry on what Jesus established. Front and center in the Church, then and now, is the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus—His Real Presence.

Reflections on the Readings

READING I: Isaiah 58:7-10 — True holiness is found in right relationships with one another.

◆ Isaiah's audience had recently returned from exile. They were frustrated that the restoration of Jerusalem was taking so long. Isaiah is unsympathetic and tells them to share with the oppressed and needy, regardless of disappointments.

READING II: 1 Corinthians 2:1-5 — St. Paul on holiness: become transparent to let God's light shine through.

◆ Facing rejection in Corinth, Paul did not preach with eloquence but with the Spirit and power of God to plant firm faith.

GOSPEL: Matthew 5:13-16 — Salt, another image of holiness; and saltiness is given by God.

◆ Jesus' disciples are to be like salt, constant and self-giving. Light symbolizes the goodness of the disciples, their sharing the life of God, who is light. Those who see the light in the disciples will praise, not the disciples, but God.

Saint of the Week

St. Jerome Emiliani

1481-1537

Jerome Emiliani was a soldier in the city state of Venice and was appointed the commander of a fortress. In a battle against a league of other city states, the fortress fell and Jerome was imprisoned. A heavy chain was wrapped around his neck, hands, and feet, and fastened to a huge chunk of marble in an underground prison. He was forgotten, alone, and treated like an animal in the gloom of a dungeon. He repented of his godless life. He prayed. He dedicated himself to the Madonna. And then, somehow, he escaped, chains in hand, and fled to a nearby city. He walked through the doors of the local church and headed to the front to fulfill a vow he had made while in prison: he approached a much-venerated statue of the Virgin Mary and placed his chains on the altar before her. He knelt, bowed his head, and prayed. His life was about to begin again.

Before his imprisonment, Jerome Emiliani's life was comfortable. He had money and was supported by family and friends. Then, suddenly and shockingly, he lived alone, naked and chained. He could have despaired in his imprisonment. He could have rejected God, viewed his sufferings as a sign of God's disfavor, become bitter, and given up. Instead, he persevered. His imprisonment was a purification. He gave his suffering purpose. When he miraculously managed to free himself, he was like a man born anew, grateful to God that the heavy prison chains no longer weighed down his body to the floor.

Once he started sprinting away from that prison, it was like he never stopped running towards God. He studied, was ordained a priest, and travelled throughout Northern Italy founding orphanages, hospitals, and homes for abandoned children, women, and outcasts of all kinds. Exercising his priestly ministry in a Europe newly split by Protestant heresies, Jerome wrote perhaps the first question-and-answer catechism to help teach Catholic doctrine. He seemed to be everywhere at once, caring for everyone except himself. While tending to the sick, he became infected and died in 1537, a martyr to generosity. His holiness and energy in doing God's will attracted followers. They eventually formed into a religious Congregation and received ecclesiastical approbation in 1540.

St. Jerome Emiliani's life hinged on one pivotal experience of facing pain, despair and death. It was a lesson for him. He endured, controlled and conquered great emotional, physical, and psychological suffering by his earnest repentance and urgent prayer. His imprisonment was transformed into a prelude to intense gratitude and generosity. Saint Jerome never lost the awe and thankfulness that filled his heart at the moment of his liberation. All was new. Life was his again. And he would place all his power and energy in God's service because, by God's loving and undeserved grace, he was a survivor.

Saint Jerome Emiliani was canonized in 1767 and named the Patron Saint of orphans and abandoned children in 1928.
