One meal a day, and two smaller meals which if added together would not exceed one full meal.

#### WHAT IS ABSTINENCE?



Abstinence is refraining from eating meat. Meat is considered to be the flesh and organs of mammals and fowl.

#### Give drink to the thirsty

Many do not have access to clean water and suffer from the lack of this basic necessity. We should support the efforts of those working towards greater accessibility of this essential resource.

#### Visit the prisoners

People in prison are still people made in the image and likeness of God. No matter what they have done, or been accused of, they deserve the opportunity to hear the Gospel and see Christianity in action, perhaps through our getting involved in a prison ministry.

#### Bury the dead

Funerals give us the opportunity to show others support during difficult times. Through our prayers and actions we comfort those who mourn a loved one and show respect for God's gift of life.

#### Give alms to the poor

Donate money to organizations that have the ability to provide support and services for those in need. Do research and find organizations that put the needy they serve first, rather than profit.

## From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

How wonderful it is to be celebrating the reopening of our newly-refurbished St. Ann Church this weekend! Praise and thanks be to God first and foremost. And praise and thanks to each one of you who supported the project in any way--and to everyone who volunteered throughout this past week to make the Church shine! What a wonderful example this has been of a Catholic community working together.

On this first weekend of Lent, I see the newness and cleansing of St. Ann Church as a timely reminder to us that the Lenten Season is a time to renew our spiritual life, to cleanse our souls, and for our Catholic faith and love of God and neighbor to shine in our actions towards others. All of us can make it our personal Lenten project to form a better beautiful relationship with Jesus Christ--who showed us how to love and who loves each one of us, opening His arms wide beckoning us to draw close to Him.

Our Parish offers help and support to achieve our personal Lenten 'refurbishment projects.' Here are some suggestions for this Lent:

**No Greater Love**, the new Lenten Bible study course starting in March, is specifically aimed at helping you to form a closer loving relationship with Jesus who loved us to the Cross.

Spend time with Jesus in **Eucharistic Adoration** in the peaceful St. Joseph Room in Assumption Church. You may find it the best way to form an intimate relationship with Him.

To deeply inspire your spiritual life, I highly recommend the **Sung Stations of the Cross** at Assumption Church at 6PM on Fridays during Lent.

To renew your prayer life, meditate on Jesus' life and love by praying the **Rosary** with one of the Parish's **Prayer Group** ministries. Sing at Lenten liturgies and pray twice!

To cleanse your souls, your priests remain always ready to hear your confession and offer you the **Sacrament of Reconciliation**. There are scheduled times: the **Communal Penance Service** at Assumption Church on Wednesday, March 25 | **Confessions** at St. Ann Church on Saturdays at 3:30~4:15PM | **Confessions** at Assumption Church on Wednesdays and Fridays after 8:30AM Mass. You can also call the Parish Office to make an appointment that works with your schedule.

Let your love of God and neighbor shine in your **Corporal Works of Mercy** (listed on page 3 of the bulletin), in serving in a Parish Ministry, and in outreach to the needy in our community, through organizations like Lazarus House and The Branches Center of Rio Grande. Let your love extend to our brothers and sisters in Christ throughout the world by your almsgiving to Catholic Relief Services.

Then, as Lent comes to a close and Holy Week begins, let your 'refurbished' Catholic faith and love for Jesus shine as you participate in the **Procession with Palms** at St. Ann Church at the start of **Palm Sunday Mass** on March 29 at 10:30AM.

Jesus loves us so much. He showed us the way to be our best, to be perfect, to be saints – so that we may have the perfect joy and peace our Heavenly Father wants to share with us. Let us draw close to Jesus with 're-opened' hearts this Lent and our Easter joy and peace will overflow.

## *Reflections on the Readings*

### **READING I: Genesis 2:7-9; 3:1-7 — God formed us from the clay.**

◆ The first thing God forms from the dust of the earth is a human. God does not form an individual named Adam; rather, "the Human" represents all of humanity. God creates a garden with two trees, the tree of life and the tree of knowledge of good and evil. Serpents were frequent symbols in Canaanite fertility cults. These cults were a source of temptation for the people of the time. In the Genesis story, the serpent is not Satan, but a clever creature of God who tempts the two humans.

### **READING II: Romans 5:12-19 — A single righteous act has saved us!**

◆ Paul's letter to the Romans shows the development of thought about the creation story. As a consequence of the first sin, disobedience against God, humans became subject to sin and have evil in the world. But, just as sin and death came to all through Adam, life and justification come to all through Christ.

### **GOSPEL: Matthew 4:1-11 — Jesus was led into the desert by the Spirit.**

◆ The story of Jesus' temptation is always the Gospel reading for the First Sunday of Lent. The three temptations attack the three human faculties with which one is commanded to love God: heart, soul and strength. The rabbis interpreted the heart as the human appetite toward good or evil, the soul as life, and might as one's wealth. The Gospel reading makes clear the difference between Jesus and Adam, the reason that Adam's act brought death and Jesus' act brought life.

## *Saint of the Week*

### **St. Polycarp**

**c. 69-c. 155**


St. Polycarp was the Bishop of Smyrna, a major city in what is now Turkey. He was a disciple of John the Apostle, who ordained him as a bishop. He was martyred around 155 A.D. The news of his martyrdom spread far and wide in his own time, making him well-known in the early Church. His death is verified by documentation so precise that it proves that he was executed on the exact date of his present feast day—February 23.

He was 86 years old when a persecution broke out against the local Church. He waited patiently at a farm outside of the city for his executioners to come and knock on his door. He was then brought before a Roman magistrate and ordered to reject his atheism. At the time, Christians were accused of atheism by the pagan "believers" since, from the Roman perspective, Christians rejected the gods and did not espouse adherence to the prevailing civic religion. The Roman gods were more patriotic symbols than objects of belief. They united the Roman citizens who would walk up marble steps of impressive columned temples, make a petition, and then burn incense on the altar of their favorite god. It required heroic courage for Polycarp, and thousands of other early Christians, not to drop some grains of incense into a flame burning before a pagan god. And not to do so was seen as treasonous.

St. Polycarp refused to renounce the truth of what he had heard as a young man from the mouth of the apostle, John: that a carpenter named Jesus, who had lived a few weeks not too far from Smyrna, had risen from the dead after His body had been placed in a guarded tomb. And this had happened recently, in the time of his own grandparents! He was prepared to die for a faith passed down to him directly from one of Jesus' own apostles and others who had seen Jesus after the Resurrection. His Christian beliefs were also firmly based on deep personal meditation and thought.

St. Irenaeus of Lyon gave us this description of Polycarp in his role as Bishop: "I could tell you the place where the blessed Polycarp sat to preach the Word of God. It is yet present to my mind with what gravity he everywhere came in and went out; what was the sanctity of his deportment, the majesty of his countenance; and what were his holy exhortations to the people. I seem to hear him now relate how he conversed with John and many others who had seen Jesus Christ, the words he had heard from their mouths."

It was this venerable man, the last living witness to the apostolic age, whose hands were bound behind him to a stake, and who, the historical records tell us, stood "like a mighty ram" as thousands screamed for his death. He was burned at the stake, and then stabbed when the fire failed to consume his body. Christians preserved and venerated his bones—the first instance of such relics of a martyr being so honored.
