


WHAT IS LENT?

The 40-day period from Ash Wednesday and before Easter Sunday. It is marked by prayer, fasting, abstinence, and other acts of penance.

PRAYING ----- FASTING ----- ABSTINENCE



WHAT IS FASTING?



One meal a day, and two smaller meals which if added together would not exceed one full meal.

WHAT IS ABSTINENCE?



Abstinence is refraining from eating meat. Meat is considered to be the flesh and organs of mammals and fowl.

PRAYERS FOR LENT

THE SEVEN PENITENTIAL PSALMS AND THE SONGS OF THE SUFFERING SERVANT

The Seven Penitential Psalms and the Songs of the Suffering Servant are traditionally used for meditation and prayer during Lent.

Prayerfully reciting [The Seven Penitential Psalms](#) helps us to recognize our sinfulness, express our sorrow and ask for God's forgiveness.

[The Songs of the Suffering Servant](#) are four poetic sections in the Book of the Prophet Isaiah. Because of the Christian identification of the Suffering Servant with Jesus, these four Servant Songs become a way of encountering Jesus as the Messiah.

On the USCCB website page cited below, you will find links to the text of these prayers, with audio versions, as well as written reflections to guide you in *Lectio Divina* ("divine reading"), a way of praying with Scripture.

From Pope Leo XIV

ASH WEDNESDAY HOMILY (EXCERPTS) | FEBRUARY 18, 2026

Dear brothers and sisters,

Even today, Lent remains a powerful time for community: *"Gather the people. Sanctify the congregation"* (Joel 2:16). We know that it has become increasingly difficult to gather people together and make them feel like a community—not in a nationalistic and aggressive way, but in a communion where each of us finds our place. Indeed, during Lent, a people is formed that recognizes its sins. These sins are evils that have not come from supposed enemies, but afflict our hearts, and exist within us. We need to respond by courageously accepting responsibility for them. Moreover, we must accept that while this attitude is countercultural, it constitutes an authentic, honest and attractive option, especially in our times, when it is so easy to feel powerless in the face of a world that is in flames. Truly, the Church exists as a community of witnesses that recognizes their sins.

Naturally, sin is personal, but it takes shape in the real and virtual contexts of life, in the attitudes we adopt towards each other that mutually impact us, and often within real economic, cultural, political and even religious "structures of sin." Scripture teaches us that opposing idolatry with worship of the living God means daring to be free, and rediscovering freedom through an exodus, a journey, where we are no longer paralyzed, rigid or complacent in our positions, but gathered together to move and change. How rare it is to find adults who repent—individuals, businesses and institutions that admit they have done wrong!

Today, we are reflecting precisely on this possibility of repentance. Indeed, it is no coincidence that, even in secularized contexts, many young people, more than in the past, are open to the invitation of Ash Wednesday. Young people especially understand clearly that it is possible to live a just lifestyle, and that there should be accountability for wrongdoings in the Church and in the world. We must therefore start where we can, with those who are around us. *"Now is the acceptable time; see, now is the day of salvation!"* (2 Cor 6:2). Let us therefore embrace the missionary significance of Lent, not in a way that distracts us from our individual efforts, but in a way that introduces this season to the many restless people of good will who are seeking authentic ways to renew their lives, within the context of the Kingdom of God and his justice.

"Why should it be said among the peoples, 'Where is their God?'" (Joel 2:17). The prophet's question is a warning. It also reminds us of what others think about us, especially those who observe the people of God from the outside. Lent urges us towards a change of direction—conversion—that makes our proclamation more credible.

We recognize our sins so that we can be converted; this is itself a sign and testimony of Resurrection. Indeed, it means that we will not remain among the ashes, but will rise up and rebuild. Then the Easter Triduum, which we will celebrate as the summit of the Lenten journey, will unleash all its beauty and meaning. This will take place if we participate, through penance, in the passage from death to life, from powerlessness to the possibilities of God.



Reflections on the Readings

READING I: Genesis 12:1-4a — I will make of you a great nation.

◆ In this reading, Abraham is obedient to God's call. Abraham is blessed by God. Ultimately, blessing is a sharing in the life of God, a sharing in God's power to bring life and to sustain it. Because of Abraham's obedience, the inexorable progress of sin and separation is reversed and God's blessing begins to fill the world.

READING II: 2 Timothy 1:8b-10 — God has called us to a holy life.

◆ The point made in this reading is that, through obedience, followers of Jesus will share in the sufferings of Jesus and then come to share forever in his glory. Through his death on the cross, Jesus has conquered death. The final goal of God's blessing is new life.

GOSPEL: Matthew 17:1-9 — Rise, and do not be afraid.

◆ In this Gospel story, Jesus leads Peter, James, and John up a high mountain, a favorite place in the Gospel of Matthew for revelation. There, the presence of God shines through Jesus and he is transformed. Moses and Elijah, representatives of the Law and the prophets, appear with Jesus.


Saint of the Week

St. Casimir 1458-1484

St. Casimir was born in Wawel Castle in Krakow, a prince of the Kingdom of Poland and the Grand Duchy of Lithuania. The deep-rooted Catholic faith and traditions of Poland were imparted to him from a young age by his teachers, especially by holy and learned priests who were like second fathers to him. He learned to love the Lord's Passion, the Sacraments, the Virgin Mary, and the Church. These loves deepened as he grew into adulthood and personally experienced the harshness of life as a soldier and the venality of life at court. Though he always had at his disposal everything that money, position, power and education could offer, and though his life was full of the intrigues and cares of war and state, he never lost sight of the higher, holy things that mattered to his soul. He yearned for God all his life. He became known and admired for his piety, faith, and generosity towards the sick and the poor. Surviving contemporary accounts describe Prince Casimir as a man of exceptional intellect and education, humility and politeness, who strove for justice and fairness.

Prince Casimir so exemplified the virtues which his Catholic birthplace treasured that he is considered and remembered as an emblematic Polish prince: virtuous, pious, just, chaste, poor in spirit, and strong. He loved and served his country, his religion, and his God with fervor. He did not seek to become a priest or a religious to live his faith; he lived the life he was born into as a layman, a prince -- and a saint. He died at the age of twenty-five, most like from tuberculosis.

St. Casimir is the patron saint of Poland, Lithuania and Lithuanian youth. His memorial is celebrated on March 4.



You know prayer is important but still find it challenging. Perhaps it's hard to find time, or you're unsure what to do when you pray. Or maybe you feel discouraged by your weaknesses and your inability to overcome them.

If you have any of these feelings, you are not alone. Many of the saints struggled in prayer. They were like us. But each time they fell, they got up again and learned to rely more on God's grace.

What God did in the lives of countless saints, he wants to do in the lives of ordinary people like us. And that's what this study is about: the journey of prayer God wants to take us on.
