Letter from Father Wallace

Dear Parishioner.

This Wednesday we begin our Lenten journey with the imposition of ashes upon our foreheads with the injunction that comes to us from the Gospel of St. Mark, "The Kingdom of God is at hand! Reform your lives and believe in the Good News!" In this Jubilee Year of Mercy we are called to mission. A contingent of parishioners under the direction of Fr. Yvans just returned from a "mission" to his beloved homeland of Haiti, where I assure you in the theology of St. Francis, it was in giving that we received. The people, especially the children in various schools and the orphanage that we visited brought Jesus to us in their faith filled lives and utter simplicity of life.

Yes we are called to mission during Lent. Our Lenten mission this year during the Year of Mercy is a call to conversion and belief in the Good News. If we willingly change our hearts and our lives, we will find the love and freedom promised by Christ. But more than that, we will also find that very real gift we all seek, joy! When we Christians are joyful, even in the worst of conditions, as we found in Haiti, we can still find joy. That is why Christianity thrives today even under the burdens of poverty and oppression, because the Christian mission delivers joy even in the worst of circumstances.

Our mission during Lent this year is described by Pope Francis as a call to conversion and a time to deepen our faith life, demonstrating and sharing it through the corporal and spiritual works of mercy. "Faith finds expression in concrete everyday actions meant to help our neighbors in body and spirit," the pope said in his message for Lent. Feeding the hungry, visiting the sick, welcoming the strangers, offering instruction, giving comfort – "on such things will we be judged," said Pope Francis. Particularly during the Year of Mercy, he said, Catholics are called to recognize their own need for God's mercy, the greatness of God's love seen in the death and resurrection of Christ and the obligation to assist others by communicating God's love and mercy through words and deeds.

Let us make our Lenten mission fruitful this year by attending our Wednesday Lenten soup and reflections, Friday Stations of the Cross and daily Masses when possible. Remembering that our mission does not stop simply at reaffirming that God is merciful, but clearly indicates that his children must be merciful, too, by living a greater love, especially by taking care of the little ones, the poor and defenseless. I pray that our Lenten mission is successful!

Misericordiae Vultus

Grace, mercy, and peace to all who continue to prayerfully reflect on Pope Francis' letter. In his words, "...so they may contemplate the face of mercy." (4)

"For his mercy endures forever." This is the refrain that repeats after each verse in Psalm 136 as it narrates the history of God's revelation. By virtue of mercy, all the events of the Old Testament are replete with profound salvific import. Mercy renders God's history with Israel a history of salvation. To repeat continually "for his mercy endures forever," as the psalm does, seems to break through the dimensions of space and time, inserting everything into the eternal mystery of love. It is as if to say that not only in history, but for all eternity man will always be under the merciful gaze of the Father. It is no accident that the people of Israel wanted to include this psalm - the "Great Hallel," as it is called - in its most important liturgical feast days.

Before the Passion, Jesus prayed with this psalm of mercy. Matthew attests to this in his Gospel when he says that, "when they had sung a hymn" (26:30), Jesus and his disciples went out to the Mount of Olives. While he was instituting the Eucharist as an everlasting memorial of himself and his paschal sacrifice, he symbolically placed this supreme act of revelation in the light of his mercy. Within the very context of mercy, Jesus entered upon his passion and death, conscious of the great mystery of love that he would consummate on the Cross. Knowing that Jesus himself prayed this psalm makes it even more important for us as Christians, challenging us to take up the refrain in our daily lives by praying these words of praise: "for his mercy endures forever."

With our eyes fixed on Jesus and his merciful gaze, we experience the love of the Most Holy Trinity. The mission Jesus received from the Father was that of revealing the mystery of divine love in its fullness. "God is love" (1 Jn 4: 8,16), John affirms for the first and only time in all of Holy Scripture. This love has now been made visible and tangible in Jesus' entire life. His person is nothing but love, a love given gratuitously. The relationships he forms with the people who approach him manifest something entirely unique and unrepeatable. The signs he works, especially in favour of sinners, the poor, the marginalized, the sick and the suffering are all meant to teach mercy. Everything in him speaks of mercy. Nothing in him is devoid of compassion."


