Message from Mary Vey, Administrative Assistant

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend we celebrate **All Saints Day**. Monday is **All Souls Day**. The two days are related but are separate celebrations.

All Saints Day is a holy day of obligation dedicated to all those who have entered heaven including the saints of the Church. On this day there is a renewed call for us to live as saints. All Saints' Day was formally started by Pope Boniface IV, who consecrated the Pantheon at Rome to the Virgin Mary and all the Martyrs on May 13 in 609 AD. The holy day was eventually established on November 1 by Pope Gregory III in the mid-eighth century as a day dedicated to the saints and their relics. The May 13 celebration was subsequently abandoned.

November 2, All Souls Day, is not a holy day of obligation. On All Souls Day we speak of all souls and ask God's mercy for them. Prayers are offered for those who are waiting to get into heaven. This feast presumes that some who die are not cleansed of their sin, therefore are barred from immediate access to heaven. As Catholics we believe that purgatory is a temporary place and the length of time spent there is dependent on the seriousness of one's sins.

It is on All Soul's Day that the **Book of the Dead** is opened to allow parishioners to write the names of relatives and friends to be remembered. However, due to Covid-19 restrictions, the books will be displayed in both St. Ann and Assumption Churches, but no one is permitted to write in the book. Rather, contact the parish office with the names to be placed in the book and the office staff will gladly record them. You may mail, call, email, fax or drop-off your loved one's names during the month of November. Make sure you designate which church you would like their name placed as well as contact information from you in case we have any questions.

This Sunday is our annual **Mass of Remembrance**. We remember & honor those who have died from October 2019 to September 2020. Please join us at St. Ann Church at 10:30AM for this special Mass

Reflections on *Mysterium Fidei* by Pope Paul VI


Sections 26-33

Following the Eucharist as a mystery, Paul VI goes on to write about the Eucharist in the context of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. One of the most aspects of the Holy Eucharist is that the Sacrifice of Christ on Mount Calvary is “re-enacted in a wonderful fashion” (MF 27). The term “re-enacted” does not have the same meaning as when a play is reenacted. The hyphen indicates a literal making present. We partake in this great mystery and play the role of “priest and victim along with Christ” through the universal priesthood we received at baptism (MF 31). Paul VI notes, however, that there must be a distinction between the universal priesthood and the hierarchical priesthood since the ordained priest is conformed to Christ uniquely and receives special graces to share in Christ’s priesthood. Nevertheless, Christ calls us to give of ourselves totally and generously to the service of God. Paul VI concludes this section quite beautifully with the Mass being an act of Christ and his Church, and because of this, no Mass is “private.” Every Mass celebrated is the Church offering herself for the salvation of the whole world. The Church recommends priests to celebrate Mass daily and be mindful of the power they received at ordination.

This idea of being a priest-victim may surprise many of us. After all, we often don’t think of Christ as the priest and victim, but he offered (which is the act of a priest) himself (which is the role of a victim). Next time we are at Mass, maybe we can reflect on the times we offered ourselves for the “service of the Divine Majesty” (MF 31); the times we put the will of God before our own will. Let us not forget the words Christ taught us, “thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.”




Carlo Acutis, who died of leukemia in 2006 aged 15, has already been dubbed "the patron saint of the internet". On Saturday, October 10 he was beatified at a ceremony in the town of Assisi and moved one step closer to sainthood. The teenager recorded purported miracles online and helped run websites for Catholic organizations. Acutis was placed on the path to sainthood after the Vatican ruled he had miraculously saved another boy's life. The Church claimed he interceded from heaven in 2013 to cure a Brazilian boy who was suffering from a rare pancreatic disease. He is believed to be the youngest contemporary person to be beatified - the last stage before sainthood.




