Dear parishioners,

What are the lessons we can learn from today's feast of the Holy Family?

My friends, by celebrating the Feast of the Holy Family, the Church encourages us to look to the Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph for inspiration, example and encouragement. Indeed, they were a model family in which both parents worked hard, and took good care of their Child so that He might grow up not only in human knowledge but also as a Child of God.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church gives the following advice to the parents: "Parents have the first responsibility for the education of their children. They bear witness to this responsibility by creating a home where tenderness, forgiveness, respect, fidelity, are the rule.

You see, the home is well suited for education in the virtues. But this my friends, requires an education in self-denial, sound judgment, and self- control. Accordingly, parents have a grave responsibility to give good example to their children."




