

A Message from Sister Marie Horstmann- Coordinator of Spanish Literacy

Dear Friends in Christ,

As we enter more fully into the Lenten spirit, the readings invite us to reflect on **temptation** as a very real part of our lives and one which compels us to rely on God's grace and the Spirit's gifts. We can recall Adam and Eve's giving in to the **temptation** to be equal to God, the Creator, and then Jesus' **temptations** in the wilderness for power and prestige, and we come to realize that temptations are part of living. And to deal head-on with the many **temptations** in our daily lives we can choose to follow Jesus' example, and in prayer before giving in to **temptation**, we can "try to live on every word that comes forth from the mouth of God" and look for ways we can serve the Lord and our brothers and sisters in need. In short, **temptations** can lead us to new life and call us to reconciliation when we make mistakes in our lives.

Take time this week to recognize the things or the circumstances in your life that for you are temptations that draw you away from the Lord. Be honest! Too much consuming, buying, spending? Too little concern for those suffering? Too much complaining and negativity? Too little time spent with family or loved ones? We are called to "choose life", and **temptations** give us the opportunity to do so. Let this Lenten time be a wake-up call to think before we act, to pray before we give in to **temptations** and to trust in the Lord's mercy when we fail to choose life.

Que este tiempo de Cuaresma sea un llamado de atención para pensar antes de actuar, para orar antes de caer en **tentaciones** y para confiar en la misericordia del Señor cuando fallamos en elegir la vida.

Readings of the Week

Reading I: Genesis 2:7-9, 3:1-7

God formed us from the clay.

- The first thing God forms from the dust of the earth is a human. God does not form an individual named Adam; rather, "the Human" represents all of humanity.
- God creates a garden with two trees, the tree of life and the tree of knowledge of good and evil.
- Serpents were frequent symbols in Canaanite fertility cults. These cults were a source of temptation for the people of the time. In the story, the serpent is not Satan, but a clever creature of God who tempts the two humans.

Reading II: Romans 5:12-19

A single righteous act has saved us!

- The reading from Paul's Letter to the Romans shows the development of thought about the creation story.
- As a consequence of the first sin, humans became subject to sin and have evil in the world.
- But, just as sin and death came to all through Adam, life and justification come to all through Christ.

Gospel : Matthew 4:1-11

Jesus was led into the desert by the Spirit.

- The story of Jesus' temptation is always the Gospel reading for the First Sunday of Lent.
- The three temptations attack the three human faculties with which one is commanded to love God: heart, soul and strength. The rabbis interpreted the heart as the human appetite toward good or evil, the soul as life, and might as one's wealth.

Family Reflection Corner

Weekly Readings Reflection

Choose one of the following activities as a way to further reflect on the Sunday readings.

- Point out to family members that Jesus was tempted just like we sometimes are, but he did not give in to temptation. Jesus was obedient to God's will. Lenten resolutions can help us choose God's will over our own. As a family talk about what Lenten resolutions each person has made. Write out these resolutions and put them inside the family Bible. Decide what you will do as a family to observe Lent this year.
- Choose a television program the family has watched or a story in the newspaper or a magazine. Look for modern temptations that cause people to do the wrong thing. Discuss with your family: What are some of the most difficult temptations people face today? What is the best way to deal with these temptations?

LITURGY CORNER

Why is Lent 40 Days?

The Lenten season is a time of preparation for the liturgical celebration of the suffering, Death and Resurrection of Christ. Many Catholics spend that time on the three practices of Lent: prayer, fasting & almsgiving. It is also a time to participate in the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

The season of Lent lasts from Ash Wednesday until the evening of Holy Thursday. If Sundays are excluded from the count, the season lasts forty days. The forty-day length is rooted in biblical usage of the number forty. Forty is typically indicative of a time of testing, trial, penance, purification, and renewal. In the New Testament, forty days is the length of Jesus' time of trial in the desert in preparation for his public ministry, proclaiming the Gospel. The forty-day period of Jesus' trial in the desert echoes a number of events in the Old Testament.

The Spirit drove Jesus out into the desert. And he remained in the desert for forty days, tempted by Satan.
Mark 1:12

The face of the earth was cleansed and purified during the promised period of days and nights that rain poured down during the great flood- "I will bring rain down on the earth for forty days and forty nights...
Gen 7:4

Moses spent forty years as a shepherd in the desert before God called him to lead the Israelites out of slavery. Acts 7:29

Moses fasted for forty days and nights on Mount Sinai before receiving the tablets of the covenant.
Ex 34:28

The prophet Elijah spent forty days in the desert before encountering God on Mount Horeb.
1Kings 19:8






