Letter from Fr. Wallace

Dear Parishioner,

As the Church celebrates this milestone in Pope Francis' papacy with his historic announcement of the extraordinary Jubilee Year of Mercy, Catholics and really all Christians throughout the world have an opportunity to reflect on how God's mercy touches our everyday lives and the life of the Church. This coming week the Christian world celebrates the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity. This week of prayer was initiated by Fr. Paul Wattson, a convert from the Episcopal Church in 1908. Throughout the world Christians set aside this week which covers the days between the feasts of St. Peter and St. Paul. The ecumenical celebration this year uses the symbols of a Bible, a lighted candle and salt to express visually the "mighty acts of the Lord," that we are called, as baptized Christians, to proclaim to the world. Both salt and light are Gospel images that Jesus uses in the Sermon on the Mount. They describe our Christian identity: You are the salt...You are the light... And they describe our mission: salt of the earth...light of the world...

Later this afternoon, Bishop Sullivan will join other Christian bishops and ministers to pray for the unity that Christ so desired at The Catholic Church of St. Mary in Cherry Hill at 3:00pm. With the overarching theme of God's Mercy this year, Christians are to bear witness to God's mighty acts in a variety of ways. By healing the wounds of the world: Wars, conflicts and abuses have wounded the emotional and relational lives of so many in our world. God's mercy helps us to beg forgiveness for the obstacles which prevent reconciliation and healing, to receive mercy and to grow in holiness. We are called, to search for truth and unity: awareness of our common identity in Christ calls us to work towards answering the questions that still divide us as Christians. We are called like the disciples on the road to Emmaus, to share our experiences and so discover, that in our common pilgrimage, Jesus Christ is among us. We are called to an active commitment to human dignity: Christians who have been brought out of darkness into the marvelous light of the Kingdom recognize the extraordinary dignity of all human life. Through common social and charitable projects, such as our ecumenical Lazarus House, to reach out to the poor, the needy, the addicted and the marginalized.

As Father Yvans and I travel with a group from our parish and local area to Haiti this coming week to share in the corporal acts of mercy, by reaching out to needy children and their families, I ask that you lift us up in prayer. Fr. Charlie Noone will be shepherding our parish for the week. Please keep us in prayer this week.

Ordinary Time in the Church's Liturgical Year is never ordinary as "ordinary goes". This is the time God gives us to focus more fully on growing in faith by listening more deeply to Jesus in order to better understand what He calls us to BE as His disciples. This year is certainly no exception as Pope Francis challenges all of us to go forth from our own "comfort zones" and contemplate the mystery of Mercy in our lives. Here we'll try to do this by offering the actual words Pope Francis spoke in Proclaiming this Extraordinary Jubilee of Mercy "Misericordiae Vultus". In Francis' words may we see the Face of Mercy and may God's blessings of Mercy be on all of us.

"Jesus Christ is the face of the Father's mercy. These words might well sum up the mystery of the Christian faith. Mercy has become living and visible in Jesus of Nazareth, reaching its culmination in Him. Jesus of Nazareth, by his words, his action, and his entire person reveals the mercy of God. We need constantly to contemplate the mystery of mercy. It is a well spring of joy, serenity, and peace. Our salvation depends on it. Mercy: the word reveals the very mystery of the Most Holy Trinity. Mercy: the ultimate and supreme act by which God comes to meet us. Mercy: the fundamental law that dwells in the heart of every person who looks sincerely into the eyes of his brothers and sisters on the path of life. Mercy: the bridge that connects God and man, opening our hearts to the hope of being loved forever despite our sinfulness. At times we are called to gaze even more attentively on mercy so that we may become a more effective sign of the father's action in our lives. For this reason I have proclaimed an Extraordinary Jubilee of Mercy as a special time for the Church, a time when the witness of believers might grow stronger and more effective."
