Letter from Sr. Rosaline

Dear Friends,

Following Vatican II, the Sunday Gospels were revised into a three year cycle: year A - Matthew; year B - Mark and year C - Luke; and the Gospel of John is read on certain Sundays throughout the three years. Luke highlights the Christ of mercy who reaches out to the poor, the outcasts, foreigners and women – much as we have heard and read from Pope Francis.

Our Old Testament reading for today is Ezra's explanation of God's covenant and Law to the Israelites. The people heard the word of God, reverenced it and went home to celebrate it. In our gospel, today, Jesus; like Ezra, picks up the scroll and reads the word of God. And, St. Paul reminds us that through Jesus we have been made one with God. Today, the Liturgy of the Word consists of a reading (from the Old Testament), a Psalm (the prayer), and another two readings. The 1st reading uses the term Law which referred to all of God's revelations to the Jews. It not only included rules and regulations; but also the wonderful stories of God's revelation to the Jews through scripture.

Today, the words of God and Francis, our Pope, challenge us not to compare ourselves with others. Rather to recognize that God has given each of us different gifts. Therefore, we should be concerned about trying to be faithful to the grace God gives us each day.

Our Gospel, today, leads us to the basic fact that we, as Christians have a distinct obligation to practice social justice – have we ignored this message? We are to help the poor, the imprisoned, the captive and the physically impaired. These are the things Jesus wants us to do, if we are followers of him. Think about your New Year's resolutions (if we are able to remember what they were). And, if not, resolve, right now, to follow the Lord's command to help others – to make "social justice" a reality in the Wildwoods. So, that one day, we might experience Jesus saying to us: "Come to me, all who labor and find life a heavy burden...You will find rest for your souls." And again, the various gospel stories such as the Good Shepherd, seeking the lost sheep and carrying it to safety; the cry of the good thief: "Lord, remember me". And, of course Jesus' reply to the murderer crucified beside him on Calvary: "Father, forgive them for they know not what they do." Thus we find a gentle, patient, forgiving, understanding and sympathetic Jesus.

Are we, a people, who doesn't understand what Christianity is all about? Are we of the mind that Christianity is all about sin and judgment, heaven and hell; and that God is a heavenly policeman watching our movements, writing down all our sins, and waiting to condemn us to hell. Please adjust your thinking and see our God as loving and merciful and without punishment and do all we are able to do to practice and promote social justice by "bringing good news to the poor, proclaiming release to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the prisoners go free, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor. Reach out to all in need! We should be concerned, not only with saving another's soul, but also their, bodies, their health, their housing and their jobs. Begin by helping others in our parish, especially at Lazarus House, which was suggested by Father Wallace in last week's letter.
