As always, there are maintenance issues that must be addressed, especially in our aging worship spaces. However, we are confident that most of the pressing items have been addressed over the past few years. Some of the issues that still remain will be able to be addressed and remedied through funds that were pledged during our CATHOLIC STRONG Capital Campaign. You will soon begin to see improvement projects within the parish buildings and grounds that will enhance your overall experience, both spiritual and comfort. I do ask for your patience as the approval process for the projects does take some time.

Information about Catholic Strong is provided in the bulletin, weekly. I am sure that you have noticed the gauge changing as the financial information is updated weekly. We are currently over 72% of our parish goal, with over \$967, 000.00 pledged to date. An important piece to this information is that this has been achieved with only 17% participation coming from just over 250 pledges. Imagine where we would be and what the possibilities could be if we had higher participation in this campaign.

In addition to the quantitative data listed here, I gratefully acknowledge the generous efforts of hundreds of parish volunteers, who over the past year, have contributed thousands of hours to support our parish and its various ministries and activities. Our volunteers play a vital role in helping our parish live its mission and help to keep all of the facets of our extremely active parish running smoothly.

I hope that you have a chance to look over the report in the bulletin and if you have any questions please don't hesitate to come see me.






Notre Dame de la Mer Parish Finance and Progress Report 2017 - 2018
